A Message from Fr. Matt

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the fall of my first year in college I played in a game versus Dartmouth. It was a freshman game, not varsity, so it was on a Friday in the late afternoon. My dad had to do a surgery on Friday morning and then he and my mom drove up after. It took almost 7 hours for them to get to my game. They got there a few minutes after kick off and after our first series on offense. I saw them walk into the stadium because not very many people were there for a freshman game. I saw them take their seats. I didn't wave because that wouldn't have been cool. There was a change of possession and I ran out and lined up. The outside linebacker opposite me had been talking a lot in the first series and I had talked back to him. He was a jerk. The first play that my parents saw, I lit the linebacker up and got in his face a little. Words were exchanged and he said something that I didn't like so, I punched him in the face! This is a stupid thing to do in football because the other guy has a helmet and facemask so I didn't hurt him and I could have broken my hand. I didn't break my hand luckily, but I did get a 15-yard unsportsman-like conduct penalty and I got thrown out of the game! My parents drove for 7 hours and saw one play before I got thrown out. As I stood on the sideline, I looked up and made eye contact with my dad. His face was not happy. Neither was my mom's. We were planning on going out for dinner after with some of my teammates and their families who had made the trip as well. After the game, I thought I was going to get an earful. I felt so stupid. But my mom and dad, although not happy that I had done what I had done, didn't grumble or complain. They had a few hours with me and they wanted it to be a good time. They made sure my hand was okay and that I understood that what I had done was wrong, but they didn't hang a guilt trip on me, even though I deserved one. What was most important was that they were there for me. They showed me great love and we had a great time. They had decided that this was what was most important and they didn't let the other stuff get in the way. There was an ad campaign in the last few years and I don't know what it was about, but I remember the tag line. "What's your 'one thing'?" It was meant to challenge us, I think, to focus on the one thing that is most important in our lives and to not get hung up, as we often do, on the other stuff of life. In the Readings for this week, we find people who are challenged to choose their "one thing." In the First Reading, Jonah is sent by God to the great city of Nineveh to preach repentance. Jonah himself had earlier been challenged to make following the Lord his "one thing." He resisted but eventually came around with the help of a big fish! Now it is Nineveh's turn. What is most important? Their present comfort? Keeping things the way that they always had been doing them? Or following the Lord, who had seen the way that they were living and was asking them to change? Nineveh chose to make pleasing God their "one thing" and they were saved.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul is warning the Corinthians that time is running out. The stuff that they think is so important does not last. Paul is encouraging the Corinthians to focus on eternal things rather than the passing things of this world; to make their relationship with God their "one thing."

In the Gospel, Jesus gives the same message of repentance that Jonah gave and encourages focusing on the eternal, the Kingdom of Heaven, as Paul did. He calls Simon and Andrew. Then James and John. Immediately these four make a decision. The stuff that seemed the most important a minute ago had now changed. Their "one thing" became following Jesus.

What is your "one thing"? For my parents on that fall day many years ago it wasn't their tiredness, it wasn't what could have seemed like a wasted trip. It was me. Being with me. Because making the effort to be with your kid has echoes in eternal life. I know that there are so many things that weigh on you and pull you this way and that. I know that there are often things in your life that disappoint you and frustrate you. Today, I think that God, not denying that those things exist, is still calling us to challenge our focus. When St. Ignatius of Loyola had to make a decision he asked two questions of himself; What decision will give Glory to God? And what decision will lead to the salvation of souls? That is eternal stuff! So again, what is your "one thing"? Make it something that echoes in eternity, like loving your wife, loving your kids, loving your enemies, doing good for others no matter what, going to confession, receiving the Eucharist. Eternal stuff! Stuff that makes everything else pale in comparison. Don't waste your time being bitter or angry. Focus on the stuff that lasts. Make these your "one thing."

WHO IS THE PATRONESS OF THE UNBORN?

Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patroness of unborn babies.



When the Holy Virgin appeared to Juan Diego, carrying within her the unborn God-man, she brought a culture of life to Mexico. Where missionary efforts had met with little success, she brought about 9 million conversions to the Catholic faith and the devout adoration of the only true God. Because of this apparition, she has been named Patroness of the Americas.
