MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

What a wonderful week we have had in the parishes! We celebrated the Feast of St. Francis, had a wonderful event with Alicia Hartle, Bishop Waltersheid was here for two days in a row to speak about Blessed Carlo Acutis and show us Blessed Carlo's amazing display of Eucharistic miracles. Lots of things going on! Sometimes I think that this is how we show ourselves that we are alive and healthy and working; we do lots of things. We have lots of things. We spin many plates and have many irons in the fire. This, we think, means that we are doing it. We are living up to our fullest potential. The Readings this week, however, kind of call us in a different direction. Instead of more, our Readings challenge us to less!

In my first assignment as a priest I witnessed kids playing a game at vacation Bible school called "The Camel and the Eye of the Needle." In this game the kids were given all kinds of good things to carry around in a backpack. They had candy and books and games and toys. First they had to run through an obstacle course and then at the very end, they had to kind of shimmy underneath this low bar to the finish line. What the kids came to realize is that they couldn't make it under the bar carrying everything. They had to take some things out of the bag in order to make it through. In the Gospel for today, Jesus says that it is easier for the camel to get through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of God. To the culture in Jesus' time this was shocking because if a person was wealthy and had many things it was thought that this person was blessed by God. They were assumed to be living a good life and those with little were assumed to be living a bad life. Jesus, as He likes to do, turns this worldly idea upside down. The rich, those who have many things, will find it hard to enter the Kingdom. Why? Because of their attachment to their many things! So Jesus here is calling us to less.

How do we know what to keep and what is extra in our lives? How do we get to less? We find the answer in the First Reading. King Solomon could have had anything in the world, but what did he ask God for? Not money. Not stuff. Not things. He asked for Wisdom. A few weeks ago I told you the line I heard that defined wisdom. It said that knowledge is knowing that a tomato is a fruit and wisdom is knowing not to put tomatoes in your fruit salad. Solomon asks for wisdom and says that he is given prudence. Does this mean that he didn't receive what he asked for? No. In fact, prudence is often defined as practical wisdom. Prudence involves action. It means to think things through and to understand with some foresight, the probable outcome of your actions. The person who is prudent discerns what action is in line with the reality of God's will

is too much and answer the challenge to less.

The Second Reading for today is really interesting. Did you even notice that even though you have read or heard a story in the Bible a hundred times, each time that you read it, it seems a little different? I notice this a lot. When I look back over the many times that I have written to you in the bulletin, I am amazed to find that what I focused on eight or ten years ago is completely different from what I am focusing on now, even though it is the exact same readings! Why do you think this is? Well the Second Reading tells us that the Word of God is "living and effective"! It's alive! *The Word Among Us* put it this way; when we read the Word of God, the Word of God also reads us! It is as if we are the man in the Gospel standing before Jesus. He says, teacher I have read these words and done them, but something is still missing. Then Jesus, the Word of God Made Flesh, reads the man and tells him what

for us, and does that. Prudence can help us to rightly discern what

more he needs to do. The Word reads the man and shows him what he needs to do to answer the challenge to less. Jesus will do the same for you and for me if we approach Him and ask Him.

This week, let us answer the challenge to less. Let us seek not to fill ourselves but to empty a little. Let us be wise and prudent. Read the Word of God and allow the Word to read you and show you what you can take out of your backpack so that you will fit under the bar.

ing it is. Blessed salt is a sacramental that is strongly associated with protection from demonic influences. Demons hate it. It is thus used in exorcisms, as protection in homes and living spaces, is often added to holy water, and is used in the older rite of baptism. Salt in the ancient world was a valuable substance. Roman soldiers were, in fact, often paid in salt(Latin: sal), which is where we get the word "salary" from. Because it has a preservative effect, it was used to preserve food and also used medicinally to prevent infections. In a related way, it symbolized immortality and preservation from spiritual corruption. It saw use in both pagan and Jewish religious rituals. We even have a scriptural basis for our use of salt, such as Elisha's blessing of the sickening waters of Jericho in the second book of Kings. This event is recalled in the present-day blessing of salt. Then he went to the spring of water and threw salt in it, and said, "Thus says the Lord. I have made this water wholesome: henceforth neither death nor miscarriage shall come from it." So the water has been wholesome to this day, according to the word which Elisha spoke.—2 Kings 2:21-22 Salt is therefore highly symbolic and its use is well-supported by Scripture. Additionally, it has always been used for flavoring and hence is associated with hospitality, good cheer, welcome, and love of neighbor—all things the devil hates. Speaking of hospitality, one of the lesser-known uses of blessed salt is as an addition to food. Yes, you can add a bit to your recipes not just for physical flavor but for spiritual blessings as well! This is a great idea to incorporate into your Thanksgiving
