

MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we begin a new year in the Church. On this First Sunday of Advent, the readings begin with a promise and end with a promise. The two promises are kind of like the bread of a sandwich. There are also some good things between the bread that I think can give us some practical actions to work on this Advent.

The first promise, that God will "raise up for David a just shoot," was kept by God with the coming of our Lord Jesus at Christmas. Remembering that the Word became flesh, that Jesus became one of us, and preparing to celebrate Christmas with clean hearts full of joy is a big part of what Advent is about. However, this is only part of what Advent is about. The second promise, which we find in the Gospel, tells us what else Advent is about. The second promise is that Jesus will come again. When He comes again, he will come as judge. When this second promise is fulfilled, you and I will stand and "face the Son of Man". How does that make you feel?

The first promise, already fulfilled, makes us feel good, doesn't it? Better than good. What we will celebrate at Christmas is amazing! God loves us so much! We will sing beautiful songs about it in church. "Away in a Manger" and "Silent Night" and "O Come all Ye Faithful". I love Christmas! But, let me ask you again, how does the second promise make you feel? You and I are going to stand before Jesus and make an account for our lives and then He will judge! How does it make you feel? Honestly, it is a little scary. But, don't panic. God is merciful and there are things that we can do.

Let's look at the stuff between the bread of these two promises. There is something in there that can help us prepare to both celebrate Christmas well this year and be more prepared to stand before the Son of Man when He comes again. It is found in our Second Reading today from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians. St. Paul says: May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all. That sounds like a nice thing to say. Something to which you would just say "Oh thanks. You too" and not really think any more of it. But what if you made that your prayer every day this First Week of Advent? I think it could be revolutionary. The reason that I think this is that this is a prayer that I say every day at Mass. I learned this prayer from Fr. Larry Richards. When I elevate the Host and again when I elevate the Chalice, I say "Lord Jesus, increase my love for you and for your people." This prayer is powerful. It has changed me. It has gotten

me through tough things and it has made me a better priest and a better person. I wonder what saying this prayer every day would do for you? I think that it will help you to get ready for Christmas and it will help you to get ready for when Jesus comes again.

Advent begins with two promises.

and for when Jesus comes again.

One already fulfilled.

One that will be fulfilled.

They are the bread of our First Sunday of Advent sandwich. The meat, or the peanut butter, of the sandwich is the challenging prayer found in the Second Reading.

Pray this prayer every day. See where it takes you.

It will change you. Give it a shot.

Let it help you get ready for Christmas

DID YOU KNOW?

Musicam Sacram The 1967 Instruction



This Instruction clarifies and articulates the Church's understanding of sacred music. It describes three categories of text of the Mass to be sung.

First Category: Dialogues

Since the Trinity is a "dialogue of love", we also imitate God's example. These dialogues are between the priest and the people, the deacon and the people and the lector and the people.

Second Category: The "Ordinary of the Mass" Texts such as Kyrie, Gloria, Creed and the Lamb of God are in this group.

Third Category: The "Proper of the Mass."
It is characterized by things that change from Mass to Mass. The Entrance Song, the Offertory Song, and the Communion Song.

"Song and music fulfill their function as signs in a manner all the more significant when they are 'more closely connected... with the liturgical action,' according to three principal criteria: beauty expressive of prayer, the unanimous participation of the assembly at the designated moments, and the solemn character of the celebration." (CCC 1157)
