MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Over the next few days, we will celebrate the Birth of Our Savior Jesus Christ! I hope that you are feeling the excitement, joy, and anticipation of the Christmas Season. If you are having a hard time doing that, I hope that your time with us over the next few days will help.

Fr. Ward, Fr. Jim, Fr. Al, Deacon Bruce and I are happy to be with you, especially during this wonderful season. Thanks for loving your priests and deacon so well. We are not perfect. I'm sure we bore you, infuriate you, and irritate you sometimes. Thanks for sticking with us. We love you and promise that we will stick with you!

The Readings for the Fourth week of Advent are filled with anticipation. The word "shall" is present eight times in the First Reading and the Psalm. It is a strong word. It is definitive, The Lord is definitely going to do something big, something real. Maybe "real" is the key word this weekend. In the Second Reading, St. Paul tells us that Jesus comes to replace all the sacrificial offerings of the past. They were signs of something else. Jesus is the real thing. Jesus is the one true sacrifice for our salvation.

This "real" theme is continued in the Gospel. It seems like a simple story of Mary traveling to see Elizabeth. But it is much more. Elizabeth knows this visit is important, as does the baby in her womb, who is John the Baptist. They know that they are encountering the real deal. But even before that, Mary's journey through the hill country follows a path that would have been well known to people of that time. Her journey took her on the same roads that King David travelled, bearing the Ark of the Covenant centuries before. The Ark contained the presence of God with his people Israel. When Mary travels these roads, she is not merely representing something in history. Mary is the New Ark. The True Ark. She carries the fullness of God Himself in her womb. David's journey pointed to God's presence with his people. Mary's journey was the real deal. The prophecy fulfilled!

As we celebrate these days together, let this realness sink in. So much of what stresses us out and burdens us isn't fully real. So much of it is our own doing. We limit ourselves with our grudges, our



inflated sense of injustice, our self-centeredness, our pride. But this is what is Real! God becomes Man! Our Savior is Born! He is born for you! Nothing, no anger, no hurt, no sickness is as real as this! This Baby is born so that we might have Eternal Life. So that we may enter a place where there is no sickness, no pain, no sorrow. This is what is real.

I pray that these days are joyful for you. I am so happy to spend them with you. Enjoy this time. Keep it real!



As followers of Christ, we are called to be a healing presence in the lives of people living with mental health challenges. We are committed to walking with them and their fami-



lies. We have started a Mental Health and Well-Being Ministry. It is vital to our mission as Catholics to reach out to offer comfort and healing as one of the church's newest ministries. It is critical to increase our knowledge and skills as we seek to serve in the Catholic mental health ministry.

Our goal is to raise awareness about mental health, reduce the stigma associated with mental illness, promote emotional well-being practices, provide educational resources, and to partner with local mental health agencies to encourage advocacy and support. This ministry prays together, offers courses, hosts speakers, and plans liturgies to raise awareness regarding the health of mind, body, and soul.

We have started a conversation and have begun to collect helpful information and resources. In the coming year, we would like to offer a series of educational activities that will help us all learn more. We see this as a way to be of service to members and friends of the congregation and reach out to our neighbors and community.

Let's Talk About Mental Health

This course is being offered by the St. Francis & St. Clare Mental Health Ministry



How can a church become a sanctuary—a place where individuals living with mental health challenges feel safe, supported, and a sense of belonging? The Sanctuary Course for Catholics was created to inspire and equip communities of faith that are asking this important question. Developed in consultation with mental health professionals, theologians, and people with lived experience, this eight-session study guide explores key mental health topics and examines meaningful ways to offer companionship, support recovery, and promote wellbeing.

The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is for anyone who wants to learn about faith and mental health. It requires no previous training or expertise—just a willingness to engage in dialogue with other believers. This course and films address difficult and sensitive topics and may not be appropriate for a young audience. It is not recommended for people ages 17 and younger.



"COME LET US ADORE HIM"





THE BELOVED ADVENT HYMN O COME, O COME, EMMANU-EL STANDS OUT SHAPPLY DUPING THE ADVENT SEASON. THE DISTINCTLY BIBLICAL FEEL OF THE LYPICS DIFFERS FROM THE MORE OVERTLY CELEBRATORY TONE OF MOST CAROLS, AND THE ACTUAL NATIVITY NARRATIVE DOESN'T APPEAR IN ITS USUAL WAY.

O COME, O COME, EMMANUEL DRAWS FROM OLD TESTA-MENT IMAGERY OF THE COMING MESSIAH, CREATING A HYMN THAT FEELS ANTICIPATORY, PROPHETIC, AND TIMELESS. ITS INCESSANT CRIES OF "O COME!" ECHO OUR OWN HEARTS' DESPERATE CRIES FOR A MESSIAH, MAKING IT A BEAUTIFUL ADVENT HYMN.

ALTHOUGH A CLASSIC AND WELL-KNOWN HYMN, THE HISTO-TY OF *O COME*, *O COME*, *EMMANUEL* IS SUPPRISINGLY SHPOUDED IN MYSTERY.


WHO WROTE THE LURICS?

IT IS DIFFICULT TO ATTRIBUTE THE LYPICS TO ANY ONE WRITER. ORIGINALLY WRITTEN IN LATIN AROUND THE 7TH OR 8TH CENTURIES, THESE VERSES ARE ACTUALLY PART OF THE DIVINE OFFICE. THEY ARE A RENDERING OF THE GREATER ADVENT ANTIPHONS, ALSO CALLED THE "O" ANTIPHONS BASED ON THE INITIAL LETTER OF EACH. THESE ARE SUNG AT THE MAGNIFICAT DURING VESPERS (EVENING PRAYER) FROM DECEMBER 17TH THROUGH DECEMBER 23PD.

WHO Wrote the Music?

THE MELODY OF O COME, O COME, EMMANUEL HAS ITS FOOTS AS FAR BACK AS 15TH-CENTURY FRANCE, WITH A RATHER UNCERTAIN HISTORY. IT WASN'T UNTIL THE 1960S THAT MUSICOLOGIST AND NUN MARY BERRY SOURCED THE 15TH-CENTURY MANUSCRIPT THAT BORE THE TUNE'S BUILDING BLOCKS, FINDING IT AMONG MANY OTHERS USED FOR PROCESSIONAL CHANTS FOR BURIALS. SO THE ACTUAL COMPOSER OF THE MUSIC FOR ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST POPULAR CAROLS IS ANONYMOUS.

O COME, O COME, EMMANUEL IS A HYMN THAT TRANSFORMS THE ATMOSPHERE OF EVERY SPACE WHERE IT IS HEARD, AS WELL AS THE HEARTS OF THOSE WHO PRAYERFULLY LISTEN TO ITS BEAUTIFUL BIBLICAL CRIES FOR THE SAVIOR WE ALL SO DESPERATELY NEED.
