

MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I heard that last weekend was some pretty tough weather. Snow and cold, huh? Well for me it was 75 degrees and sunny with a nice breeze off of Tampa Bay! I was really blessed last weekend to be able to be with all of my brothers and sisters and many of my nieces and nephews for my nephew Chris's wedding in Tampa, Florida. It was beautiful. I had a really great time with my family. Chris and his wife Kaitlin seemed to have a really wonderful day.

This wedding was different from many of my family weddings. Chris wasn't raised in the Church and neither was Kaitlin. Yep, priest's families have weddings like that too! The wedding was in Kaitlin's parents' backyard. The officiant of the wedding was a judge for whom Kaitlin had worked. In their wedding registry, Chris and Kaitlin had listed many causes that they encouraged people to support instead of giving them a gift. Some of the causes were very much not causes that I or many in my family support. Some of the causes were diametrically opposed to the Teaching of the Church. When I first got the invitation and saw the registry, I was pretty shocked, to be honest. I shared this with the members of our young adult group earlier this year and asked them what they thought I should do. What would you do? Would you go?

There is a pretty famous electronic sign at the corner of Route 422 and Bonniebrook Road. I am sure that a lot of you have seen it. I see it many times a week, if not daily, in my travels between our churches. Sometimes there are good things on the sign. Sometimes there are bad things on the sign. Sometimes there are outrageous things. What there is almost always is judgement.

Jesus warns us today to stop judging. He tells us that the way we judge others will be the way that we are judged. Some people in our society use this as a cop out. They think that this means that there is no truth, no right, no wrong. This is not the case. There is Truth and it does not come from our opinions, it comes from God. What Jesus is warning us against today is judgement not of actions, but of the person. We must judge actions. We must believe, if we be-

lieve in Jesus, that there is right and wrong. However, judgement of a person belongs to God, not to us.

So, what would you have done if you were in my shoes? The young adult group encouraged me that I needed to go to my nephew's wedding. He is my nephew and I love him and he needs to know that. However, they also encouraged me that I needed to say something, not at the wedding, but before I went, to stand up for the truth about human life and the dignity of each person. This I did. I spoke with Chris and Kaitlin about what I, and most of my family, believe about some of the causes that they asked us to support. I told them that I was coming to their wedding because I loved them and wanted to celebrate their love for each other.

The night before the wedding I was walking into the welcome party that they had at the Florida Aquarium. One of my sisters asked me what I thought of the things listed on their wedding registry. As we talked, she told me that when she saw it, she knew that she had to come. She said "Matt, we are on a mission to show everyone the love of Jesus Christ. We are on a mission this weekend to change their hearts by showing them love." My sister was right. I don't know if we changed any hearts but we did show everyone love. Maybe we planted a seed that will bloom in the future? In our First Reading this week, David had a chance to kill Saul. He didn't do it. He didn't tell Saul that everything Saul believed was right. He didn't tell Saul that his desire to kill David was good. No. But David reserved the judgement of the person Saul, to God. Judgement of the person belonged to God not to David. Hopefully, I followed David's example this weekend. By choosing to go to the wedding I kept open the door to my relationship with my nephew, who I truly love, and hopefully planted some seeds that could lead to a change of heart in some of the places that are not in line with the Truth that comes from God. We will see, I guess.

This week, let us challenge ourselves about whether we act more like David or more like Saul. Take seriously Jesus' warning about how we judge others. We must judge our own actions and the actions of others. We must stand up for the Truth that comes from God. However, we must also leave the judgement of the person to the one to whom it belongs. That is God alone.
