MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This is a feast day that celebrates a great mystery; God is three and God is one. Three Persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, but one God. This day tells us of the nature of God. It is not our place to fully understand or comprehend the nature of God; the mystery of the Trinity is a good thing. However, what we can know about it, is good for us to know, for this mystery tells us much about our own nature, about who we are and about how we were made to live.

Scott Hahn says that in the First Reading for today, "we begin at the heart of the Trinity." Wisdom, eternally begotten, is poured forth to the delight of the Father. He is with the Father before the beginning, and is the "Craftsman" who with the Father, establishes the heavens and the foundations of the world. Their relationship is one of delight. The Father delighted as Wisdom played on the surface of the Earth and as Wisdom played, He found delight in the human race. Think about that for a minute. Do you know the feeling that you have when you watch your kids or grandkids or nieces and nephews play in the yard or on the ballfield or on the stage? The joy that you feel when you see them out there just giving their best, having fun with their friends? Do you love seeing them play? I know that you do. That is how God feels about us! We are God's delight! How cool is that?

It is very cool. But this cool thing gives us an insight into the very nature of God and into the very nature of us. What is central is relationship. We have all heard the phrase "God is love." C. S. Lewis points out that this saying has no meaning unless God contains more than one person. "Love is something that one person has for another person. If God was a single person, then before the world was made, God was not love..." But God was indeed and is indeed love, so by nature God must be a relationship of persons. Lewis continues; "God is not a static thing, but a dynamic, pulsating activity, almost a kind of drama. Almost a kind of dance." The nature of God is a dance!

In the Trinity we find the Persons, who dance and play and unselfishly pour out love for each other, in One God. This is the God in whose image and likeness you and I are created. This is who we are. Who we were created to be. This is who we must be in order to find happiness and meaning in our lives. Lewis says that "each one of us has got to enter that pattern, take their place in that dance. There is no other way to the happiness for which we were made."



There is a song that Lee Ann Womack sang a good while ago called "I Hope You Dance". It is a nice song. I remember my sister telling me that this song made her cry. Her son, one of my nephews, was really struggling. He was down on himself and she was so worried about him. She said this song was kind of her prayer for him. I think that in some ways, this is God's hope for us as well.

God desires that we enter the pattern of the Trinity in whose image and likeness we were created, that we enter the dance. It is a dance of unselfish love for others that we pour out and at the same time, get filled up, because of the unselfish love that is poured into us. This is where true meaning and happiness are found. When we join in this dance of unselfish love, we are being who we are created to be.

The Trinity is a mystery that we cannot fully understand. But what we can understand is that this God is a relationship of three persons and that relationship is one of unselfish love. God made us to be a part of this dance and invites each of us to it. I hope you dance!

DID YOU KNOW?

Husbands, Fathers and Saints

When we look at the lives of canonized fathers, we see that they all display fortitude in




principles, fervor in faith, reliance on God's strength, and devotion to their family's spiritual growth. Today, let's focus on three fathers:

BI. Luigi Beltrame Quattrocchi: Born 1880, died 1951. He was brought up by his uncle and aunt, as they were childless. Luigi's house was always open to beggars and, during the World Wars, to refugees. He and his wife consecrated their family to the Sacred Heart and prayed the Rosary daily with their four children. Additionally, they kept a family Holy Hour on First Fridays, attended retreats, and continually studied their Faith. Inspired by this example, three of Luigi's children entered religious life; the remaining daughter became a consecrated virgin.

St. Thomas More: Born 1478, died 1535. His last words, "I die the king's good servant, and God's first" summarize his whole life. Initially attracted to religious life, Thomas instead married and had four children. He imparted to his children the rich classical education he himself had received and passed on to them his fervent love of God. Before his contrived execution for treason, Thomas ensured—from his prison cell—that all his family could safely escape the country.

St. Stephen I of Hungary: Born 975, died 1038. A child -convert from paganism, he is known as the first king of Hungary. As chief of the Magyars, his objective was to weld the migratory group into a solid nation. He accomplished this through various measures, primarily through his support and promotion of the Catholic Faith. He was crowned king in 1001. He instilled his own deep faith in his son, urging him to remain a devout Catholic king above all else and to protect the growth of the young Church in Hungary. This son is also a saint. ~*The Catholic Company*
