

But it does not make use of its sensitiveness to defend its own rights, to protest against the ingratitude of others, or to demand some degree of justice; it sacrifices all these to God for the benefit of those who have caused it suffering.

This is the characteristic of Charity.



Pastor Father Bill's Weekly Column

Dear Parish Family,

The second reading this weekend from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians is the famous hymn of love. St. Paul writes, "love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude... it bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails."

While this is one of the most well-known passages from the New Testament, sometimes its full depth is not well understood. It seems that in our world the notion of love is often emptied of meaning. For St. Paul, love is so much more than just a fleeting feeling. Love is not an emotion, it is an action, a choice made and willed. From a Christian perspective, to love means to will the good of another even if at one's own expense. In essence, real love is constituted by self-sacrifice

Jesus Himself expresses this in the Gospel saying "greater love has no man than to lay down his life for his friends". Thus understood, love is far from a mere warm feeling of affection for another, rather it is the willing choice to die for another. In our modern culture, the idea of love has become marred by selfishness and selfdetermination. It is not for us to craft our own ideas or expressions of love. God is love, manifested most perfectly in the selfsacrifice of Christ on the cross. If we wish to love, we must imitate Him.
