Dear Parish Family,

In the Gospel this weekend, we hear the famous story of the Wedding at Cana. In this story, we witness the first miracle performed in Jesus public life. When the wine runs short at the wedding banquet, Jesus, at the behest of his mother, miraculously turns water into wine, thus revealing His Divine power.

At first, Jesus is hesitant to intervene, saying that His hour has not yet come. Nonetheless, Mary persists and Jesus does eventually heed her request. In many ways, this is a model and source for Catholic spirituality regarding the Blessed Mother. Despite His hesitancy, Jesus does what his mother asks of him.

Inspired by this, we as Catholics should turn frequently to the Virgin Mary, asking for her intercession. We do not pray to Mary as a parallel or equal to God Himself. Rather, we ask Mary to pray for us, to speak to her son on our behalf. We do so with confidence, knowing that Jesus, a faithful and obedient son, will hear his mother's requests.
