

## MESSAGE FROM FR. JACK GRAHAM, PASTOR

Lent, like Advent, is a season of preparation. We are meant to see both of these Church seasons as times when we, as the people of God, prepare ourselves to celebrate some great act of God's love for us. Advent prepares us to celebrate the great gift of the Incarnation; God's loving us so much that He decides to share our very nature. Lent is the time that we prepare to celebrate the single greatest act of salvation history, the resurrection of Christ from the dead. These two great acts by God on our behalf have given us the hope of everlasting life. Christmas and Easter are such great acts of God that we should feel the need to do something to prepare ourselves to celebrate them in an appropriate manner.

This week marks the start of the second week of Lent. It is not too late for us to commit ourselves to using the upcoming weeks well. I have always found it a challenge to figure out what I should do for Lent. Like many of you I often have given something up. Most years I have done so almost automatically, without really thinking about why I was doing what I was doing. I simply did what I was doing because it was Lent. There is something about this practice that can feel a bit empty to me; empty because giving something up becomes an

end and not a means. What I mean is that without understanding why I am doing what I am doing, the giving up becomes an empty gesture.

I don't know what you are doing this Lent. I do, however, want to encourage all of you to make sure that there is a purpose to what you decide to do. The purpose should not be to lose weight or break a bad habit; the purpose should be to allow God into your life and to allow his grace to change you. Fasting is meant to remind us that nothing, no matter how good, should be more important to us than God. Adding things into our life, like prayer or daily Mass, is meant to make time for God to break into our lives and bear fruit.

This is truly a sacred time. My prayer, for you and all those that you love, is that this Lent will be more than just the 46 days leading up to Easter. I pray that these weeks will only help you to grow closer to God and allow God's grace to help change you into the person that God longs for each of us to be.

Why does the priest wear purple during Lent?

## Answer

During Lent you will see the color purple all around the church and on the priest's vestments. The color purple during Lent signifies Royalty and Crucifixion.

#### Royalty-

In the ancient world the color purple was associated with royalty. To make the color purple back then was very expensive and only royal people could afford to have their clothing dyed that color.

#### Crucifixion-

When the Roman soldiers mocked Jesus before his crucifixion, they "clothed him in a purple cloak, and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on him" (Mark 15:17)

Then Pilate showed Jesus to the crowd, saying, "what shall I do with the man whom you call the King of the Jews?" (Mark 15:12).

From this horrific scene, purple becomes a reminder of Jesus' Passion and death; as well as, the reminder that Jesus is the true royalty the "King of Kings"
