MESSAGE FROM FR. JACK GRAHAM, PASTOR

Several weeks ago I used this space to write about some upcoming changes in the schedules at Saint Mary and Saint Joseph. With the decrease in the number of priests serving in the Archdiocese, it is becoming more and more difficult for local parishes to continue to offer Mass on the frequency that they did in the past. Here in our collaborative, for instance, we now have one priest assigned to serve both parishes. At the present time, each Sunday we celebrate Mass at seven different times. Not only that, but those Masses also overlap so that it is not possible for one priest to cover all seven. When Fr. Culloty is with us, this schedule is manageable; even then, however, we are just one illness or injury away from having a problem. While Fr. Culloty is off on pilgrimage enjoying is retirement, I struggled to find enough priests to meet the demands of the current schedule. Next week I hope to be able to announce a new Mass schedule, a schedule that would allow me to better meet the needs of the parish using our current resources.

Before getting to the Sunday Schedule I have decided that this is a good time to make one other change. It may be hard to believe, but Easter will be with us at the end of this month. Easter is the most important day on the Christian calendar, and Holy week is the most important week. The high point of Holy Week is the Sacred Triduum. Those three days, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday bring to a climax the

great rescue mission that God launched to save us all. If you have ever participated in this most sacred time then you know how important and how powerful these three days can be.

Since my arrival here, we have celebrated the Triduum in both of our parishes. For the past several years, the Holy Thursday celebration has been a bilingual celebration along with our Brazilian Community. This year, because of the changes that we have experienced, I have decided that we will combine our services so that our two parishes will celebrate most of the Triduum together. This Holy week I have decided to celebrate Holy Thursday, the night we celebrate the institution of both the Eucharist and the Priesthood, at Saint Mary. The Easter Vigil, Holy Saturday, will be held at Saint Joseph. On Good Friday, Veneration of the Cross services will be held at both Saint Mary and Saint Joseph.

I know that change can be difficult. I do believe that these changes will not only help me to better meet the needs of the people of our Collaborative, but will also help me to do a better job of leading our people at these most important liturgical celebrations. Thank you for your support, and please continue pray for our two beautiful parishes.

That means that we are free to make our own choices. If these two things are true, Hell has to exist.

God wants us all to go to Heaven, but he loves and respects us enough to allow us to make the choice to love Him (that is to chose heaven) or to reject Him (to choose to be separated from Him). Since God is the source of all love, happiness, and joy, to be separated from Him is to be separated from those great goods. That is why Helf is a place of suffering. When we do the things that we call sins, we are making the choice to reject God's love and friendship; we are choosing to go to Hell.
