SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

Kids will be returning to school soon. Across our Supervisory Union towns of Hartland, Weathersfield, Windsor, and West Windsor, hundreds of children qualify for free and reduced price school lunch. Their families will struggle to pay for much needed school supplies. Especially in the time of COVID, it's important that each child have their own supplies and not share with other students.

Old South Church, Mt. Ascutney Hospital, and Sled Dog Disco -- a Windsor-based group focused on building developmental assets in youth -- are hosting a school supply drive on behalf of WSESU. Our goal is to raise \$5,000 to purchase supplies for all 455 WSESU children who qualify for free or reduced price school lunch.

The schools have given us their supply lists, now we need your help to raise the funds to purchase them. A donation of \$13 will cover supplies for one Elementary School student. A donation of \$11 will cover supplies for one Middle School student. A donation of \$10 will cover supplies for one High School student. Donations in any amount are welcome!
