IMPORTANT NOTE FROM THE DIOCESE PROPOSITION 5 Proposed Vermont Constitutional Amendment

Vermont Catholics have grown weary of divisive politics, particularly the politics around our state's abortion laws. Tragically, Vermont law currently *allows abortion through all nine months of pregnancy* (Act 47), and there is little hope for change as long as the current legislative supermajority remains in place. Meanwhile, Catholics, along with all those in the pro-life community, continue to focus on providing hope, support and alternatives to abortion and strive to change hearts and minds, always keeping in mind that statutes can be amended and repealed. More difficult to change is the State Constitution, however.

The Vermont Legislature is moving forward with an amendment that, if passed, promises to *enshrine unlimited, unregulated abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy in our state's founding document*. Proposal 5, also known as Article 22, would permanently *block any attempt to protect the unborn* — *even those who can survive outside the womb.* It is expected to reach the final phase of the approval process in time to be put before the voters in November 2022.

"How hard is it for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God." St. Mark tells us our Lords disciples are amazed at these words. Why? Well, because even today thousands of years after He first uttered those words there are those who believe that material prosperity is a sign of divine favor and material poverty is likewise a sign of divine displeasure

But wealth in and of itself is not the problem, Saint Katherine Drexel born into wealth and privilege in 19th century Philadelphia used her vast fortune to achieve great good, founding schools to educate African American and Native Americans mired in poverty. Ebenezer Scrooge the unlikely hero of Charles Dickens classic "A Christmas Carol" is transformed one memorable Christmas eve from a pitiless miser to a man who epitomizes the very goodness and generosity of Christ, Himself.

Jesus well knew wealth can ensnare us, distracting us, luring us to prefer the ease and comfort worldly wealth can give. We should instead use the wealth we might have to enrich the lives of others.
