A Message from Father Cyrain

At the heart of this gospel, the encounter between Christ and the Canaanite woman, God shows that he plays no favorites and that nobody is excluded from his company. His Good News was not exclusive for the Jewish people but to be shared among all people and nationalities. And part and parcel of Jesus' mission was to break down barriers and to remove walls of division and prejudice between Jews and Gentiles. His mercy surpasses all human boundaries and touches all who seek it.

This gospel confronts us with our own tendency to cause conflict by promoting exclusiveness. Many of us are biased against people simply because their political and religious outlook differs from our own. We fail to remember that no seats are reserved in heaven for any particular following. What is necessary, if we are to get there, is to have faith in God and rely in him.

In a real church community, everyone should be made welcome no matter how they may be dressed, how uncouth they may be, or how low in esteem society may hold them. The good news is that everyone can call upon God in their need and receive his mercy because, unlike us, he has a heart for everybody.

The unwavering faith of the Canaanite woman, knowing full well that she was an outsider, can be a good reminder every time we feel like our prayers are unanswered. As the mystic writer Thomas Merton once puts it: "Faith is to know and accept that you are loved by God despite one's unworthiness."

Eucharistic Revival

The Eucharist also reminds us that we are not isolated individuals, but one body. As the people in the desert gathered the manna that fell from heaven and shared it in their families, so Jesus, the Bread come down from Heaven, calls us together to receive him and to share him with one another. The Eucharist is not a sacrament "for me"; it is the sacrament of the many, who form one body, God's holy and faithful people. (Pope Francis Homily – June 18, 2017
