A message from Father Cyrain....

Today's gospel is forthright in reminding us of the blunt truth that the gifts of God are not ours to dispense with as we please. Neither does it suffice to hide them away, leave them unused or allow them to wither. As Christians, we are in the business of spreading the kingdom of God. Whatever our gifts, we are all expected to make full use of them for His glory. God does not desire our stagnation but our flourishing.

The message is to make a great deal more of life, to tackle it positively with enthusiasm. Failure to use our talents can be caused by a poor self-image based on the false belief that we have nothing to offer, of making a mistake, of not being good enough. Giving in to these fears, we risk missing out on the profound experience and growth God has in store for us.

Few among us will be given the opportunity of performing the spectacular, but never forget we will be remembered for our little daily acts of kindness and decency which we regard as nothing special. Ordinary work, when done with zeal and a willing heart, helps the love of God to be visible in the dark corners of our lives.

Eucharistic Revival:

We should never forget that the Last Supper of Jesus took place "on the night he was betrayed" (1Cor 11:23). In the bread and in the wine which we offer and around which we gather, the gift of Christ's body and blood is renewed every time for the remission of our sins. We must go to Mass humbly, like sinners and the Lord reconciles us. (Pope Francis General Audience — February 12, 2014

Looking Ahead to Advent: December 3, the first Sunday of Advent, starts us off with a new liturgical cycle. For that reason, it is an opportunity for us all to begin anew. Beginning anew means that we let go of our past sin and hurt and ask Jesus to enter in. It means we turn to Him for a fresh start and have hope in all that He wants to accomplish in our lives. It is time for a fresh start! Advent follows a certain theme of preparation and anticipation. At first, we reflect upon the fact that the Savior of the World will one day return in all His glory. We look to that truth and anticipate it with great hope. From there, we look at the fact that He did come long ago as a child. He was born of the Virgin and dwelt among us. Christmas is the fulfillment of the hope given in Advent and is the realization of God's promise. God humbled Himself, becoming a little child entrusted to the care of Blessed Mary of Nazareth. She became not only the Mother of God, she became our Mother in Grace. May we all meet our Lord and His mother more deeply this Advent and Christmas season.

Advent Wreath Blessing (at home): In the weeks before Christmas, an Advent wreath helps us prepare for Jesus' coming. Every week we light one of the candles that are symbols of Jesus, who is the Light of the World. The candles are arranged in a circle that reminds us that God has no beginning or end. The colors of the candles match the Advent-season colors. Three are violet, the color of penance, which is sorrow for our sins. One is pink or rose-colored to remind us that we look forward to the joy of celebrating Jesus' coming. Dear Jesus, as we light the candle(s) on this Advent wreath, may the light of your presence bring joy to our hearts. Bless our family and our friends, and be with all those who are in need. Amen
