A message from Father Cyrain.... The main protagonist this Second Sunday of Advent calls people to repentance. But the Baptist's call goes beyond a simple confession of wrongdoings. It involves a profound change of the whole person and demands turning our backs on old self-centered habits. John gives some down to earth advice on how to smooth a passageway for Christ coming into our lives by pointing out obstacles and barriers at the door of our hearts that need to be removed.

Among the valleys to be filled in are the many gaping sins of omission, our neglect of neighbors, and those wasted opportunities for helping others. The mountains of our pride can only be levelled out by the daily practice of the virtue of humility. Preparing a way for the Lord means walking a new path and welcoming God involves removing all blockages which prevent him from coming closer.

The voice of John reminds us that we have the important task of announcing Christ to others. Our everyday life is a message telling everyone through acts of kindness, honesty, and fidelity that Christ is right here with us. The Baptist also invites us to turn this Advent into a real spiritual homecoming by making the necessary preparations for the arrival of the Savior into our lives.

Eucharistic Revival: It is possible for each one of us to meet the Son of God, experiencing all of his love and infinite mercy. We are able to encounter Him truly present in the Sacraments, especially in the Eucharist. We are able to recognize Him in the faces of our brothers and sisters, especially in the poor, the sick, the imprisoned, the displaced: they are the living flesh of the suffering Christ and the visible image of the invisible God. (Pope Francis Angelus – January 11, 2015)
