Dear Parishioners,

I will still like to begin this episode with gratitude. The reason is that we can never be grateful enough for what we (Fr. Jon and I) have received from God through the great and loving hearts we meet in life, especially in our two parishes here, Morrisville and Stowe. May God continue to bless you and fulfil your hearts' desires.

The Christmas season is over but the joy of Christ still goes on with us still. This Christmas was my best Christmas in the United States. Why was it so? On the Christmas day, all I had in my mind was to conclude the Holy Mass and get back to the rectory and sleep for the greater part of the day till evening. My decision was so because I felt my body needed some rest after the fatigue of the few days of busy activities. After the Mass, as I was greeting the faithful while they were leaving, a family invited me for breakfast. Within me, I never wanted to go, but on a second note I decided to go and stay for few minutes and leave. On reaching there, everything I had planned changed. I saw seven young people of college age there, and I ended up spending half of my day there. Just like the young Jesus in the midst of the learned answering their questions, so was I in their midst discussing issues of faith and morality that, at the end of the day I never remembered I was tired, having spent my time meaningfully and interestingly with the young people. The striking thing was that they were attentive and we ended with prayers. My heart was filled with joy while leaving them for living up to my vocation.

John the Baptist pointed at Christ as the "Lamb of God", it is our bounding duty as Christians to point out the Lamb of God to people in the world; that is our only vocation. This vocation summarizes all other vocations. St. John Paul II described vocation as a dialogue, "In the hidden recesses of the human heart the grace of vocation takes the form of a dialogue. It is a dialogue between Christ and an individual, in which a personal invitation is given." This dialogue can only take place in the silence of our hearts. "Without the capacity for silence, man is incapable of hearing, loving, and understanding the people around him." Cardinal Sarah, "The Power of Silence." God bless you!
