We are fundraising to help the family of a priest, Fr. Selvam, MSFS order, and his sister, Sr. Helen, FSM order: Fr. Selvam is a missionary working in a remote Indian village, Sedam, where the Hindus are prominent. His sister is a missionary working in France. They are the youngest 2 children (out of 10) and needed to build their mom a new house (it originally had no bathroom - she shared a bathroom which is 70ft away from her house, only one bedroom, and very limited kitchen facilities). The rest of their family is not in a position help as they have limited means, not having graduated elementary school. He and his sister tore down the original house and built a very small structure - one room with a kitchen and bathroom - which stands incomplete as the outside plastering has not been done. During monsoon season the building will suffer much damage without this being finished. They also need to add a room so he and his sister can stay with her when visiting. They estimate it will be \$3,500 to do the plastering and add another room. They appreciate any and all help we can send their way!

Natural Family Planning Awareness Week July 24–30, 2022


“Called to the Joy of Love, Natural Family Planning, Supporting God’s gifts of love and life in marriage” is the theme of this year’s national Natural Family Planning Awareness Week (July 24–30, 2022).

As an educational campaign of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), “NFP Week” celebrates God’s design for married love and the gift of life and raises awareness about Natural Family Planning (NFP) methods. “NFP,” as the U.S. bishops have written, are supportive of Catholic beliefs about married love because NFP “respects the God-given power to love a new human life into being.

These dates highlight the anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae vitae* (July 25) which articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, marriage, conjugal love and responsible parenthood.

The Diocese of Burlington joins with the U.S. bishops in highlighting the benefits of NFP as ethical methods to help married couples live God’s design for their marriages. 
