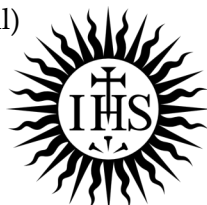

Dear Parishioners,

Who doesn't love a good story?? So much of history, culture, and family tradition gets passed on through remembering and sharing stories. With the explosion in digital media in the last 15 years there is so much available to watch, read, or listen to. I think about a coach I had one time who said, "Whatever you put in, you'll get out." How true it is with the different kinds of media we consume and its content. I spoke to someone recently who has taken a break from the major news sources because they shared with me, "Father, every time I watch, listen or read news from the major networks, I find myself getting so anxious and depressed – like giving my peace away. And it's been getting harder to get it back!"

I find myself continually trying to screen different kinds of digital media for good content, things that are family appropriate, wholesome, well-done, and have a good message. Our FORMED subscription as a parish is one great place to spend some time with trustworthy media. (Formed.org)

A married couple I know recently began a podcast that I'd like to introduce you to called, "Saints Alive." Saints Alive tells the stories of different saints in the context of their lived circumstances and relationships. Not only are they inspiring and well-done, but they also really aim at inspiring our young people to be faithful and strive for virtue in their daily living. Above all, the stories communicate how much the saints are like us and we are like them in our shared humanity, and how through opening that humanity up to God, we too can be transformed into Catholic Superheroes whose lives inspire others! Even though the target audience is children, parents and adults will certainly receive some deep insights and inspiration from hearing the stories of grace that God wrote through the lives of His saints...who doesn't love a good story? Families that I've shared it with will often listen to it in the car when they're driving their children back and forth to different activities instead of listening to the radio (the episodes average about 30 minutes).

Dear Friends in Christ,

Pope Francis has said that “being the Church, being the People of God, means being God’s leaven in this our humanity.” Each of us is called to be the sign of God’s love, hope, and salvation to the world, to build the kingdom of God and joyfully draw others to the faith.

As we celebrate the 170th anniversary of the Diocese of Burlington this year, I am amazed by the many people who have risen to this call with an open heart and given so generously of their time, talent, and treasure to build our Diocese throughout the years. We have grown from humble beginnings of only five priests and a handful of parishes to 55 priests, 63 parishes, 12 Catholic schools, and ministries that serve the elderly and poor. None of this was easy. Our Diocese has faced many challenges including world wars, the Spanish influenza, and the Great Depression. We have survived cultural battles and anti-Catholic sentiment, always staying true to the Gospel. Together, we stand for the sanctity of all life; we educate our youth in the faith; and we care for those on the margins. We celebrate the Mass in communion each week and are strengthened by the Eucharist to share our faith with others.

The foundation of our Diocese was built by our parents, grandparents, and great grandparents. This legacy of faith has been handed over to us. We are the leaven for the next generation. Many of the ministries, churches, and schools built during the past 170 years exist today. It is our responsibility to continue the mission so we can share the beauty of our faith for years to come.

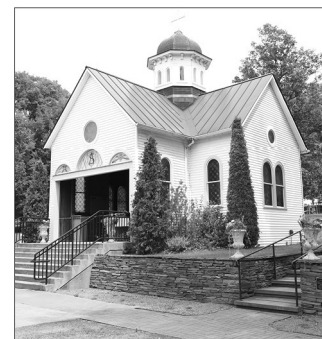

5-Day Silent Retreat • St. Anne’s Shrine, Isle La Motte

Retreat begins Sunday, June 11 at 7 pm and concludes Friday, June 16 at 1 pm.

The Society of St. Edmund will be conducting a 5-Day Directed Retreat in the Ignatian tradition. Using principles from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, retreatants are invited

to contemplate scripture passages in a silent environment, celebrate daily Eucharist and meet with a Spiritual Director each day. Spiritual Directors are specifically trained for this type of retreat and will serve as companions

and co-discerners of the Spirit during the retreat. Applicants should be comfortable maintaining an atmosphere of silence and be able to share their prayer experience with a Spiritual Director in a daily meeting of about forty-five minutes.

The cost is \$550 per person which includes a private room and all meals. Space is limited due to private bedroom accommodations and married couples attending will be assigned to separate cabins.
