Dear Parishioners,

"The LORD has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy." Psalm 126.3

I'm so grateful to God, Fr Jon, my helping crew, and you all for successful fundraisers that we had in the past. We did cook well every time, but we used to say very gladly that God added taste to the food. I'm thankful to you all for your support and generosity towards every fundraiser. I was very much surprised to know that we made \$33,013.52 after expenses between BSC & MHNJ parishes. (To send Aulani Morris to the Benedictine monastery - \$7896; to St Louis Institute for Deaf and Blind, Chennai, India - \$5048; to hurricane relief - \$4131.84; to Percy farm, Stowe - \$3205; to Religious Education - \$1443.01; to help Abigail for cancer treatment - \$1568; to Fr Selvam and Sr Helen family in India - \$4252.91; to build bathroom for the girls at St Paul's Higher Secondary School in my native parish - \$5468.71). I really admire and appreciate your generosity. I'm thankful to God for He blessed us to be able help others in need.

I recently planned to do another fundraiser for my diocesan seminarians at 4pm on 7th of June 2023 in both of our parishes. There are 42 seminarians who are studying in different levels of formation to become priests for my diocese of Palayamkottai, India. My diocese needs your help because it is expensive to feed, pay for tuition and provide lodging for all seminarians. Many adult men want to join the seminary but because it is expensive, the diocese is not able to choose all who aspire to become priests. I remember gladly of my maternal grandpa Mr Irudayaraj, a catechist in his hometown, who was also went blind from his young age, right after his marriage. He used to lead morning and evening prayers form his memory at least 30 minutes every time. He sang all songs from his memory. He was very helpful to all pastors of his parish. The priests liked him much because of his spirituality and faith. I had to pay less than \$5 every month to the seminary but my parents couldn't do that. In order to help me continue my formation in the seminary, my grandpa used to take me to visit with his previous pastors to ask for help. I used to lead him holding his hand and the priests were generous to help

While I was studying in the major seminary, the seminary asked me to write a letter requesting for help to the propagation of faith which would forward that letter to a donor in any country. Some of my friends who had European last names, were gifted with 8 to 10 benefactors who would send money to the Propagation of Faith to help their studies, but I didn't get one for at least 9 to 10 months. Paul Gravina from Malta, Europe chose my name to sponsor because I'm also Paul. He was a carpenter who spared his money to pay for my studies. I'm so grateful to him that he himself made a missal stand with beautiful carvings, and gifted it to me for my first Mass. It is still in my parish in India. I have received much help from many people throughout my formation and I want to pay it back. This is why I started the fundraisers. I wish I do at least 3 fundraisers every year; one for my school where I studied, the second one for my diocesan seminarians, India and the third one for St Louis Institute for Deaf and Blind, India. With all your help and through the grace of God, we can do many great things like these. I pray that God bless you all abundantly. May your generosity and kindness become a blessing for your family.



5-Day Silent Retreat • St. Anne's Shrine, Isle La Motte

The Society of St. Edmund will be conducting a 5-Day Directed Retreat in the Ignatian tradition. Using principles from the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, retreatants are invited
