With grateful heart to the Almighty, I'm announcing to you all that I received the Advance Parole (which lets me visit India and come back to the USA) and Employment Authorization Card (which allows me to work in the USA). These documents are valid until next July, 2025.

I feel that this result is the fruit of many prayers and the intercession of St Padre Pio. I have felt the providence of God throughout the process and I thank Fr. Jon and you all for your fervent prayers. I know how much you feel for me visiting my family in India and I will soon give the dates of my visit back home. In the meanwhile, please keep praying harder that I may receive the actual green card soon.

I would also like to discuss a new situation aside from the above update. While planning my trip to India, I tried to find priests to cover for the weekend Masses in my absence, which was a great struggle. I even phoned a priest from NY! The retired priests of our Diocese of Burlington help us a lot. They do a wonderful job in parishes and we are grateful for them. They need more of our prayers because health issues prevent some from helping out.

I believe that the shortage of priests in the Church, is the result of shortage of catechism to the kids and shortage of family prayer. Priests come from families, and so family is the first catechism teacher of a future priest. I was brought up in faith by my family. I was led to the church by my family and I was supported by my family in my call to priesthood. I strongly believe that I would not be a priest without them. Of course, God works through the family and God meets the kids through the family. Vatican Council II says, "Family is a domestic church." Family prayer, teaching catechism to the kids in the family and accompanying the kids in their faith journey is incredibly important to every catholic family. I strongly believe that this will result in an abundance of vocations.

I pray that the Catholic world realizes this importance. May God bless all families. Fr Jon and I also pray for families who struggled with the flood recently. Have a great weekend.

The Real Presence of Jesus Christ



As we walk through the Eucharistic Revival in the light of the Emmaus experience¹ throughout the United States, we must also be aware of the real presence of the Holy Eucharist among us through the Scripture. Jesus calls us “to be the witness of these things.”² This article gives a couple of mustard seeds that we can use to move mountains before us and to increase our faith in the “Real Presence of Jesus Christ” by reading the Holy Bible.

The Holy Mass is full of mysteries to mediate and to reflect on daily. To know Jesus Christ fully, we need to “taste and see”³ these mysteries in the Holy Bible. Mysteries are made known by revelation⁴, as St. Paul says, “For I did not receive it from a human being, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ.”⁵ The Word of God is a mystery, and we need a spirit of boldness to open our mouths if we want to talk about the Word to anyone.⁶

Consequently, Psalm 119:130 states, “The revelation of your words sheds light, gives understanding to the simple.” We know Jesus is the Light of the World.⁷ The Word must unfold itself by the mercy of God⁸ and the living Word⁹ can only be received by a humble and contrite heart.¹⁰ The Light shines in the darkness and darkness cannot overcome it.¹¹ The verdict, St. John says, is “that The Light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to Light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates The Light and does not come

toward The Light so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to The Light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.”¹²

There are two ways we respond to the mystery of the Word in the Holy Eucharist:

1. “If today you hear God’s Voice¹³, do not harden your hearts.”¹⁴
2. “When I found your words, I devoured them; your words were my joy, the happiness of my heart.”¹⁵

The first response shows our tendency to stop reading the Holy Scripture because of being close-minded towards God’s Word. Something turns us off when we read the Holy Bible. By contrast, the second response shows that we are in love with the Word of God.

What is the effect of the Word in our Eucharistic life?
