Dear Parishioners,

This upcoming week from 10/10-10/15, we will have 10 Marian Sisters visiting us from Nebraska! So... who are the Marian Sisters? They are a community of religious Sisters who originated in (what was then) Czechoslovakia, and after their Motherhouse was confiscated by the Communist government, two of the sisters fled the religious suppression and with the help of those involved in the underground they escaped to Austria in 1950.

Bishop Kucera (Diocese of Lincoln, NE) arranged for them to come to America and work in an orphanage in the Lincoln Diocese. 1954 began the official new American community of their order. Their original name - The Mercy Sisters of St. Francis - was changed to the Marian Sisters of the Diocese of Lincoln. As they continue to live their Franciscan heritage, they also have our Blessed Mother as their example and role model, thus their char**ism,** "To do God's will joyfully in imitation of Mary and St. Francis."

In July of 2022, I was blessed to lead their community retreat and spend time getting to know the sisters. Afterwards, I invited them to come to Vermont for maple creemees, fall foliage, to visit close-by St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal, and spend some time with my awesome parishes and the youth at our local Catholic School (ASCA)...unsure if they would be willing to make the trek from Nebraska! Mother AnnMarie contacted me this past spring and said, "Father...we're coming!" We are so grateful to welcome them to Vermont, our Diocese, and especially into our parish family.

While they are visiting, they will join us for (10/10)Tuesday 5pm Mass and October Devotions at Most Holy Name of Jesus and then join us for a reception as the Crosby Center. Wednesday at All Saints Catholic Academy, they will visit the children in the classrooms, followed by a maple creemee taste testing adventure! Thursday after morning Mass they'll visit St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal during the day, and then stop by and visit the college students at Catholic Center at UVM in the evening. Friday, October 13, they will lead a Marian procession from the school to the Crosby Center and then offer a retreat day with the upper school children. Friday evening, please come and join us from 6-7pm for a Holy Hour at MHNJ where the sisters will be available to pray with you. A special Saturday 9am Mass at Blessed Sacrament with the Diocesan Lay Ministry program. a light reception afterwards. Sunday morning 8am at both parishes will be their final event with us, and then back to Nebraska! Please pray for safe travels for the Sisters and for good weather while they are here! We look forward to welcoming them to our parish family this week.




