Dear Parishioners,

Happy New Year!! Advent ushers in a new liturgical year and inaugurates a new season of grace and growth in the life of the Church. As the Church and the priest's is adorned in violet vestments, we remember that we are entering a season of preparation and penitence.

In the Liturgy of the Word at Mass we heard predominantly from the Gospel of St. Matthew throughout this past year – Year A. Beginning a new liturgical year this first Sunday of Advent, Year B, we will be listening to the Gospels of St. Mark throughout this year – particularly during Ordinary Time (green). Also during the liturgy you'll notice that we fast from singing the Gloria during Advent because with Mary, we are waiting for the birth of Jesus, our Savior. Christmas Eve will be the first time we sing "Glory to God in the Highest...," as it was first sung by the myriad of Angels who appeared to the shepherds outside of Bethlehem to proclaim "good news of great joy!"

The one exception is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day of obligation, on Friday, December 8th. Mary, from the first moment that she was conceived, was saved by Jesus from sin and death. Jesus is the savior, Mary is the saved; Jesus is the redeemer...Mary is the redeemed. She was the first to experience the power of Christ's redemption... even before He was born in time! This awesome mystery teaches us the power of God who can apply the benefits of Christ's saving action outside of time, as He did with our Blessed Mother to prepare her for the role she would have in Salvation history. In the liturgy for this Solemnity, the Gloria will be proclaimed as the joyful cry of the Church acknowledging the gift of salvation received by the human race.

Remember your Advent candles. There are some great apps you can use to prepare. The dollar store is selling Advent Calendars. Please do something in your home to celebrate and honor this beautiful season of grace. And for your heart, remember to make a commitment to prayer and silence. If its been awhile since you've gone to confession, I can think of no better way to prepare your soul for Christmas. May this season bless you with an increased longing for the hidden one, the babe of Bethlehem.

4th Sunday of Advent v. Christmas Obligations

December 24 falls on a Sunday this year. Note there are two obligations – for the 4th Sunday of Advent and for the Solemnity of Christmas. The obligation for the 4th Sunday of Advent is fulfilled by a vigil Mass on Saturday, December 23 or Mass on the *morning* of December 24. The obligation for Christmas (a Holy Day of Obligation) is fulfilled by Mass in the *late afternoon/evening* of December 24 (after 4pm) or on December 25.

hen we think of Advent, it's natural that Christmas isn't far behind in our minds. And with Christmas on our minds, the time of

Advent becomes obscured. Instead of a "period of devout and expectant delight" as one Church document describes Advent, we find the endless to-do lists: Christmas shopping, Christmascard writing, prepping for meals, Christmas decorating. Advent is indeed a time of preparation for Christmas, but I'd like to propose another way of thinking about Advent, and it is simply this: at the center of Advent is the theme of time.

As a season of preparation for Christmas, Advent gives us an opportunity to look back in time — at the coming of God in the flesh into the world. Observing the Nativity of the Lord at Christmas is an ancient custom in the Church, and the Nativity forms one of the two hinges of the liturgical year (Easter is the other one). Just as we need to prepare for our own celebration of Christmas, we also need to spend time spiritually preparing to celebrate and remember the birth of our Lord. Advent gives us that time. The latter part of Advent, especially, focuses on this theme of looking back in time in preparation to celebrate the first coming of Jesus.

Much of Advent, however, gives us the opportunity to look forward in time — to the glorious coming of Christ at the end of time. Thinking about the end times can be a frightening idea and scripture even alludes to this fear ("May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping!" Mark 13:36 — First Sunday

of Advent), but this doesn't have to be a fearful time. In fact, Advent calls us to be ready for the Second Coming of Christ and to wait for the Second Coming with joyful anticipation. Why is this? Because of what is ultimately promised in the Second Coming: "God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (1 Corinthians 3:9 — First Sunday of Advent). In the midst of the calamity that is foretold, there is a message of hope and redemption.

Finally, Advent calls us to take the time to look at the present and seek Christ in our lives today. Advent offers us a time to renew our relationship with Christ today, especially through the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation. Do we see Christ in those in need? Sometimes, we don't even need to look further than our own families.

So, let us take the time for Advent. Let us take the time to thank God for the gift of Himself in the child Jesus. Let us take the time to continually acknowledge the presence of God in our lives today. Let us take the time to prepare ourselves for the Second Coming or, more personally, take the time to prepare to meet Christ at the end of our own earthly existence. If we take the time to enter into the opportunity Advent gives us to look at time — past, present, and future, then we will be ready to receive Christ into our lives, not only at Christmastime, but all the time.
