Dear Parishioners,

Perhaps the most iconic hymn of the Advent season is, 'Veni, Veni, Emmauel" or "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" and for good reason! While the words have their root in the Bible (mostly Old Testament), the lyrics trace back to monasteries from the 8th century. They adapt what is known as the "O Antiphons" – seven special titles attributed to the Messiah that conclude the final week of Advent as a proximate preparation for Christmas that enrich the meaning of the mystery of the Incarnation. Each antiphon begins as follows:

O Sapentia (Wisdom)

O Adonai (Hebrew word for God)

O Radix Jesse (stem or root of Jesse)

O Clavis David (key of David)

O Oriens (dayspring)

O Rex genitium (King of the Gentiles)

O Emmanuel

Interestingly, each of these names were chosen and ordered to reveal a hidden meaning of the 'O Antiphons.' When the first letter of each of the titles in Latin is put together, it spells the acronym, "SARCORE." When read backwards, as one is leading up to Christmas, the letters form a two-word acrostic, "ERO CRAS," which is Latin for, "I will be present tomorrow."

That haunting melody traces back to a 15th century French missal discovered in Lisbon, Portugal, and it was chanted during a funeral procession while carrying the body from the Church to the cemetery. How fitting that a melody used to mark the end of one's earthly life would now become the tone that begins the new liturgical year. Consider the powerful image which matches the order of nature around us - out of the darkness and the cold comes the Light of the world who brings forth the warmth of the Father's love.

The experience of both lyrics and melody together are meant to evoke a time in history when the people of Israel longed for the fulfillment of God's promise to send the Messiah, and one experiences this deep desire awaken within. It is this desire that Christians embrace as we long for the celebration of a Father who keeps his promises and sent His only Son to save us.


