Dear Parishioners,

After King Henry VIII outlawed Catholicism in England in 1558, Catholics – especially priests - went into hiding. Any practice of the faith (public or private) was prohibited and considered a crime. If one were caught with anything in writing indicating adherence to Catholicism, one could be imprisoned, hanged, or shortened by a head. Creatively, as Catholics clung to their faith in secret, they devised ways of passing on the treasure of our beliefs and teachings. One such clever construction is the traditional Christmas hymn, "The 12 Days of Christmas." At first listen, it doesn't have any overtly Christian references...which was exactly the

The "true love" mentioned in the song doesn't refer to an earthly romantic pursuer, but to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person. The partridge in a pear treat is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. In the song, Christ is symbolically represented as a mother partridge which mimics injury to decoy predators from her helpless babies. It calls to mind a moment in His life when Jesus looking over the city, cried: "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, who kills the prophets and stones those who have been sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, the way a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were unwilling" (Mat 23:37). See how the number of each day teaches an essential lesson about the faith, like a mini-Catechism put to music!

1st Day – Partridge: Jesus Christ

2nd Day – Two Turtle Doves: the two testaments, Old and

3rd Day – Three French Hens: the 3 theological virtues (faith, hope, and charity)

Ath Day – Four Calling Birds: the 4 Gospel Evangelists (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John)

5th Day – Five Golden Rings: the 5 first books of the Bible, called the Pentateuch or Torah

6th Day – Six Geese: the six days of creation

7th Day – Seven Swans: the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit

8th Day – Eight Maids: the 8 Beatitudes from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount

9th Day – Nine Ladies Dancing: the 9 fruits of the Holy

10th Day - Ten Lords: the 10 Commandments

11th Day – Eleven Pipers: the 11 faithful Apostles

12th Day – Twelve Drummers Drumming: the 12 tenets of the Apostles' Creed


