Pope Francis is set to arrive in Alberta, Canada on July 24, 2022.

The Pope will make three stops on his five day tour: Edmonton, Alberta, the province that hosted the most residential schools in Canada at 25; Quebec City, Montreal, for "an eastern hub"; and Iqaluit, Nunavut in the Canadian Arctic Archipelago, home to the largest congregation of Inuit people in Canada.

Indigenous participation in each stop on the Pope's journey across the country, titled "walking together," is encouraged, according to information put out by the Vatican. The Pope's first stop in Alberta will be at Maskwacis, the grounds of one of the largest residential school sites in the country, Ermineskin Residential School.
