

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER CYRAIN:

Christmas is almost upon us and on this fourth Sunday of Advent, our thoughts turn to Mary, soon to be Mother of God, at a singular moment that forever altered the tapestry of salvation history.

The Annunciation was the moment when God first revealed a mystery kept secret for ages - God not only wants to become one of us, but that we may become like Mary as well. THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY IS JANUARY 6TH: The Epiphany marks the arrival of visitors, identified in Scripture as the magi, to the place where Jesus was born. Although we know virtually nothing about them, we do know they brought three gifts:

- 1. Gold a symbol of wealth and power, identifies the recipient as a king.
- 2. Frankincense the crystalized resinous sap of a tree used as incense and as an offering, is symbolic of prayer.
- 3. Myrrh another resinous tree sap, was used in healing liniments and as an embalming ointment. Myrrh is an odd gift for a child—so, even at the beginning of Jesus' life on earth, this gift foreshadows his death.

May the wisdom of the Magi guide you to your own light.


