




**HAPPY NEW YEAR!** January, traditionally, is the time when many of us to resolve to eat better and lose weight. But the New Year is also the perfect time to make some spiritual resolutions as well. Some possible resolutions could be to attend a weekday Mass, pray the rosary daily, or give up meat on Fridays.

**THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY IS JANUARY 6TH:** The Epiphany marks the arrival of visitors, identified in Scripture as the magi, to the place where Jesus was born. Although we know virtually nothing about them, we do know they brought three gifts:

- 1. Gold a symbol of wealth and power, identifies the recipient as a king.
- 2. Frankincense the crystalized resinous sap of a tree used as incense and as an offering, is symbolic of prayer.
- 3. Myrrh another resinous tree sap, was used in healing liniments and as an embalming ointment. Myrrh is an odd gift for a child—so, even at the beginning of Jesus' life on earth, this gift foreshadows his death.

May the wisdom of the Magi guide you to your own light.


