On the other hand, we are not living in the time of Noah when God destroyed the world with a flood, the time of the Roman Empire's decline, or even during the Dark Ages. It seems like our world has always had it's challenges in the great struggle between good and evil.

This past weekend thieves reached out to parishioners asking them to buy gift cards as a favor for me and the parish. They were instructed where to go and what to do with the gift cards and they used my name and our parish's good reputation as leverage. These emails are becoming more and more common these days. People know how generous we are as a faith community and they try to take advantage of our generosity. Please know that neither I, nor anyone on the leadership team will ever ask for money or gift cards through email. This is a scam. You can simply delete emails like this or even report the emails as fraud.

Since this note involves the topic of generosity, let me close by thanking you for all the ways you support our parishes each week through the collection as well as your generosity for the school and food shelves. Each month we report in the bulletin where we are in our annual goal for collecting money for our ministries. I will be presenting on finances in greater detail soon. Thank you!
