
First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.

From the Associate Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

"The more things change the more they remain the same." That thought comes to mind after events of last weekend. As most of you know I was scheduled to go to the Cleveland Clinic for long-anticipated back surgery. For a year and a half now, I have had debilitating sciatica back pain. The surgery scheduled for May 17th was to be the last possible healing solution.

While visiting my primary doctor this past week I told him of my improvement through the intensive physical therapy of these past six months. Although I still have severe back pain it is not as debilitating as in the past and the sciatica pain shooting down my leg has subsided. My doctor said I should not have the surgery since it is that which would have alleviated the leg pain. The surgery would not have addressed the back pain, just the leg pain. And potential complications in such surgery suggest a conservative approach.

My doctor called the Cleveland Clinic and gave them his recommendation to cancel the surgery. The neurosurgeon accepted his recommendation and canceled my surgery. I am to continue the physical therapy in the hope that it will bring greater relief.

Needless to say, I was stunned by this development. I will have a new MRI shortly to see if any changes to the damaged nerves have occurred. I am told that a natural healing could be at work.

Thank you so much for your prayers and encouragement throughout this time. I am well aware that other parishioners are also dealing with health concerns. Let us all continue to pray for each other's healing and well-being.
