### **RECONCILATION**


First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.

## From the Faith Formation Desk 🕏

This weekend, we gather in celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. While I leave the in-depth reflection on this profound mystery to scripture scholars, it's important to note that this feast invites us to contemplate the nature of our triune God -Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - and how we're called to live in relationship with one another.

I have the blessing of working with families through the Faith Formation program and sacramental preparation. The increasing presence of young families in church is truly heartening.

Reflecting on my own journey, I recall the challenging, yet endearing days of self-described "baby wrestling" and engaging my boys with the simple wonder of spotting ladybugs in the windows at the church's entrance when they were restless sitting in the pews. These personal experiences make me appreciate even more the dedication of today's parents who bring their young children to Mass.

I recently read a compelling article by Monica Portogallo from the Holy Cross Family Ministries, through the Catholic Mom.com ministry. In it, she eloquently articulates what moms who bring their little kids to Mass need most from their fellow parishioners:

- Smile at us.
- Tell me my kids are cute.
- Pray for me.
- Tell me you wish your kids took your grandchildren to Mass, the way I do.
- Say you love seeing and hearing little ones at Mass.
- Let me know that you hope to see our family next Sunday.
- *Tell me I'm doing something important that's good for my* children.
- Say I'm doing a good job.

According to Monica, sometimes, a gracious response can mean the difference between attending Mass regularly and falling away from the faith.

These young families and children are the future of our church. Pray for them, encourage them, and on the more challenging days, have patience and understanding that they have made the choice to share their faith with their families. Let's keep fostering a community that uplifts each other in faith, for in doing so, we're truly living out the love of the Holy Trinity.
