
First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.

# From the Pastor's Desk

On Sunday, July 16<sup>th</sup> Saint John the Baptist Church will be hosting relics of Saint Padre Pio from 11am-6pm. Relics have been venerated by Catholics for nearly 2000 years – the catacombs in Rome testify to this practice. Below is a short reflection from one of our parishioners, Mary Spina, testifying to her devotion (thank you, Mary!):

"Have you ever wondered why we venerate a relic of a saint? Does the idea of a carefully preserved arm bone or bloody piece of cloth gross you out? Welcome to one of the great treasures of our Catholic Church!

Some Catholics will tell you that preserving the relics of saints is like having an item belonging to a deceased loved one. We cherish a piece of jewelry, a rosary, a special tool or other keepsake, and holding, using, or wearing it brings beloved memories and makes us feel closer to a special someone who is no longer with us. Our saint's relics are all this, yet are so much more. Most of us have never met someone who has gone on to be a canonized saint, yet their stories have been passed on in Catholic tradition over two millennia. We often recognize something personal in these tales of suffering and hardship, courage and perseverance, and are inspired by the triumphs of such men, women, and even children. We identify with some aspect of their lives and adopt them as our patron saints. We feel as if we know them, and they can become as beloved to us as a favorite relative. With all of the resources available in Heaven, a saint can also identify with us and come to know and care for us as well! They truly become our "friends in high places."

Love has always been the most important virtue of all our Catholic saints, and that love of God and mankind surpasses the distance and time which separates us from them. Such Love is the source of the miracles which often bless us when we venerate a relic or say a prayer asking a saint to intercede for us. We can have full confidence that the saint is in Heaven with the Holy Trinity. The saint can hear our prayers, and lovingly petition Our Lord for us. Through the saint's love for us, and our love for the saint, with hope and faith, it is God, with Perfect Love for both, who performs the miracle according to His Most Merciful Will.

So make friends with a saint today, and maybe even, venerate a relic, a true treasure of our Faith!" -Mary Spina
