
First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.



From the Pastor's Desk

I first heard of *Totus Tuus* when I was a young priest working in our Office of Vocations and directing our Undergraduate Seminary Program. One of the young men applying to the seminary named his participation in *Totus Tuus* as one of the events that led him to consider a vocation to the priesthood and religious life. He told me that *Totus Tuus* was the motto of Saint Pope John Paul II. The literal translation for *Totus Tuus* is "all yours." To Saint John Paul II it meant that he chose to give himself fully to Jesus through Mary.

This week our parish is hosting *Totus Tuus*. There will be more than 50 young people attending a week-long "camp" dedicating time to deepen their faith. Like Fr. Jarrod, I have heard from several students in our parish who have participated in *Totus Tuus* in the past and see this annual week as a highlight for their summer. They can't wait for it to start!

Our students will be participating in *Totus Tuus* from July 9-14th. This week is "dedicated to sharing the Gospel and promoting the Catholic Faith through evangelization, catechesis, Christian witness, and Eucharistic worship" (taken from *Totus Tuus* website). They will have the opportunity for daily mass, reconciliation, adoration, devotional prayers, and much more. Please keep our students in your prayers throughout this week. As our society continues to deemphasize the importance of our relationship with God, *Totus Tuus* helps our youth be a light for all nations to see.

Blessings to our participants, the missionaries and chaplains who accompany them, and our leaders (especially Mary Drew) who make this all possible!
