
First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.

From the Pastor's Desk

Last week I enjoyed meeting with our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC). EMHC help the priests and deacon distribute Holy Communion at Mass and some take Communion to those who are homebound or in nursing homes. At our meeting, we renewed our understanding of Holy Communion. As Catholics we take Jesus at His word in John chapter 6 (beginning at verse 22): "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

In our discussion, a few topics came up that I would like to address. First, receiving the Consecrated Host (the Body of Christ) or receiving from the Chalice (the Blood of Christ) is receiving Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. In other words, the Consecrated Host is fully Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The same is true of the Chalice. Even if you only consume one Species, you are receiving the fullness of Jesus.

If you do choose to receive from the chalice, the minister will announce "the Blood of Christ." After you respond "Amen" you are invited to drink from the chalice. Our EMHC told me that some Catholics have kept the Consecrated Host in their hand, approached the minister, and desire to dip the Host into the Chalice and receive Communion. This "dipping" has an official word called "intinction." But intinction may only be done by a priest and that is not how we distribute Communion at our parish.

Finally, some parishioners need to receive special hosts that contain the lowest amount of gluten. There has been some confusion about where parishioners can find those hosts. Beginning this weekend an altar server will hold a pyx between the center ministers so that those who need these hosts can join either communion line and simply request a low-gluten Consecrated Host.
