
First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.

From the Pastor's Desk

Tuesday, August 15th is the feast of the Assumption of Mary. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "...the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when in the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians (paragraph 966).

This is an important feast day for us to celebrate. It points to the promise made to us at our baptism that just as Jesus ascended to heaven, so too will we rise body and soul on the last day! Mary's Assumption to heaven is part of the fulfillment of the promise. Mary followed Jesus, and we too shall follow on the last day. This feast is a Holy Day of Obligation and the Mass schedule is published in the bulletin.

Some Christians have a difficult time accepting this feast day because it is not recorded in the bible. However, Mary would not be the first person taken up to heaven body and soul. In the Old Testament, we read about two holy men (who were not preserved from original sin like Mary was): Enoch and Elijah. "Enoch walked with God, and he was no longer here for God took him" (Genesis 5: 24). "As they walked on still conversing, a fiery chariot and fiery horses came between the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind" (2 Kings 2:11).

As we celebrate the Assumption, let us ponder the decisions we make in our own lives so like Enoch, Elijah, and Mary, we might follow Jesus to heaven on the last day.
