From the Pastor's Desk

On Friday, September 15th, the Church celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. In religious art, Our Lady of Sorrows is depicted with seven swords piercing her heart recalling the words of the prophet Simeon at the presentation of Jesus. "And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted and you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:34-

Traditionally the Church has named seven sorrows of Mary: Simeon's prophecy, the flight into Egypt, Jesus being lost in the temple, meeting Jesus carrying His cross, the crucifixion, taking Jesus down from the cross, and the burial of Jesus. Mary, like her Son Jesus, and like you and me knew sorrow and sadness in her life. We recall on this feast day that God can transform any sorrow with His grace. The feast day is a reminder of the joy of the resurrection!

The Congregation of Holy Cross holds Our Lady of Sorrows as a special patron. Like Mary, we in the Congregation strive to bear our crosses and hardships trusting in God's power and love.


