From the Pastor's Desk

World events are troubling. The terrorism against the Jewish people is evil and we keep them in prayer. The Israelites are our ancestors in faith. They were the first to be chosen by God to receive His revelation. In addition to being a people of faith, they are also an ethnic community. Let us continue to pray for peace in our world.

Last week our Pastoral Councils met. Each of their four committees reported and received feedback. The Evangelization Committee has several events planned for this upcoming year. The next one is the weekend "Light of the World" retreat which is being hosted at Saint John the Baptist Parish beginning on October 27th. It is not too late to register. You can find sign-up sheets at both churches and parish offices.

The Ministry to the Elderly Committee has been training to bring the Holy Eucharist to our nursing homes and homebound parishioners. Their committee will help Fr. Hugh and I know when our parishioners need the Sacrament of Anointing.

The Liturgy Committee discussed the various ministries that surround our common worship. As the United States celebrates the Year of the Eucharist, all ministers are being retrained and invited to be more intentional about their ministries.

Finally, the Pastoral Council discussed a proposal to change the Sunday Mass schedule. We received a petition to move the Sunday Mass time at Sacred Heart Saint Francis de Sales from 8 am to 9 am or 9:30 am. There is both support and opposition to this petition. Any change of the schedule will impact the Sunday Mass time at Saint John the Baptist and our religious education program. The Council is prayerfully discerning this topic between now and our next meeting in November. If you would like to voice your opinion, please email me or a Council member.
