#### **RECONCILATION**


First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.



Dear Parishioners,

Father Kevin offered me his Bulletin space "From the Pastor's Desk" to write a note of thanks to everyone for celebrating the 50th Jubilee of my ordination to the priesthood. On Sunday, October 8th we celebrated at St. John the Baptist Church and on Sunday, October 15th we celebrated at Sacred Heart, St. Francis Church. I am very grateful to everyone who extended their prayers and best wishes.

I had hoped to "fly under the radar" at the time of the Jubilee to escape making any kind of special fanfare for the occasion. But some parishioners who knew about the April 28, 1973, ordination date were vocal about having a parish recognition. I was and am very humbled by the celebrations. I feel very blessed to have been called to the priesthood and especially blessed to have the opportunity to be a priest here in Bennington and North Bennington these past 7 years. All of you have been very kind and generous in offering your prayers and encouragement.

The history of the Church since Vatican II has seen an incredible shift in the way people worship God. We Catholics have undergone enormous change over these past 60 years. Some people have become disillusioned and have even decided to leave the Church and express their faith and worship in new settings. Some people have abandoned their faith in God altogether. Many older parishioners have been heartbroken by the decision of their children to move away from their faith and their Church altogether in these secular times. And of course, the seemingly unforgiveable sins of clergy have brought ruin and destruction upon us all.

These have been challenging times, to say the least. But for me, I humbly express my gratitude to all of you for your deep faith in God and the Creed of our Church. I truly believe, as do you, in the truth of God's steadfast love for all of us. God knows our human sin, weakness, and inability to live as faithfully in his love as we would hope. All of us are sinners but we know God's mercy and forgiveness are our salvation.

All of you have reinforced our Catholic faith for me through your own good lives. You have invited me into your hearts where I have found a deepened sense of the Kingdom of God. Our faith expresses the meaning, purpose and joy of our lives. I cannot image living life apart from our Catholic faith.

Thank you for welcoming me into your lives, for reinforcing for me your love of the priesthood and the Sacraments, particularly the Sacrament of the Eucharist which I believe, as do you, to be the apex of life.

You are a beautiful gift of God's grace for me, one I cherish with all my heart. As the mystic Dag Hammarskjöld stated so simply and forthrightly: "For all that has been thanks; for all that will be yes."
