Sunday Summary

Wisdom 6:12-16 Wisdom is an attribute worth keeping the light on for.

Psalm 63:2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8 The thirst of the soul is for God alone, and nothing else will satisfy.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 The real "rapture" is experienced by those who are always with the Lord.

Matthew 25:1-13 The wise keep vigil for the unsuspected hour of God's fulfillment.

From the Pastor's Desk

On the feast of All Saints Day, we gave thanks to God for the graces that enabled women and men to say "yes" to His will and follow His call to holiness of life. We also asked for their intercession so that we too might grow in holiness.

The next day, All Souls Day, we gathered to remember the souls of all those who have died. Many of us remember our family members, friends, neighbors, and coworkers. At our parishes, we are invited to write the names of these beloved dead in our Book of Remembrance. Throughout November, we hold these people in our prayers asking God to invite them into eternal life in heaven

It is good for us to remember our beloved dead in November. And, as a Catholic community, we also remember the souls we may or may not know: the souls in purgatory. The church teaches that at our death, we face judgment for the way we lived our lives. Heaven is the hope of all believers – it is life with God! Hell is the absence of God and our dread. Purgatory is a "purification so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven," which is experienced by those "who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1030). The Catechism clarifies that "this final purification of the elect ... is entirely different from the punishment of the damned (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1031). Therefore, purgatory is a hopeful state where God prepares us for the joy of heaven. Just like the saints who pray for us, we pray for the souls in purgatory that they swiftly accept God's purifying grace and enter heaven.

An interesting book that deals with purgatory is called "The Great Divorce" by C.S. Lewis. I used to think this book was about matrimony, but it is not. If you would like to pray about purgatory with a fictional narrative background, I recommend this book to you.

Gospel: In the parable of the ten virgins, Jesus is teaching about the importance of being prepared for his Second Coming. In what ways is this directive from Jesus a challenge for you?

Join us for a Vermont Catholic Advance Care Directive workshop!

When: Saturday, November 18 at 10:30 A.M. Where: SHSF Parish Center at 238 Main Street, Bennington What: The Vermont Catholic Advance Directive is an mportant legal document that enables a person to direct his or her healthcare agent and care providers to act on his or her behalf in a manner consistent with Catholic teachings in the event of an accident or end of life illness. This workshop will enable participants to understand Catholic teaching on health care and ensure their desires are met.

Deacon Pete Gummere will conduct this workshop in which he will explain Catholic teachings on health care. Deacon Gummere, in addition to holding graduate degrees in Biological Science and Theology, is certified in Catholic Healthcare Ethics by the National Catholic Bioethics Center. Although he has retired as an adjunct faculty member of the Pontifical College's Diaconate Institute, Deacon Pete has continued to teach classes in Moral Theology, Medical Morality, and a course in Philosophy for Understanding Theology. He is also a published author.

Tony Tomasi said that he took the seminar a number of years ago and that It was very informative and helpful. He made some adjustments to his end of life documents.
