
First Saturday of the month from 9:30 - 10:30 am and by appointment.



From the Pastor's Desk

We have begun the Holy Season of Lent. Like Jesus who spent 40 days in the desert overcoming temptation, so we spend 40 days in this season to do the same. We were reminded on Ash Wednesday that the tools of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving help us to imitate Jesus' obedience to the Father's will.

Before Archbishop Covne moved to his new assignment in the Archdiocese of Hartford, he had a meeting with pastors asking us to consider broadcasting Catholic content on the radio. There was a window of opportunity when the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) was accepting new applications for radio stations and we decided to apply. Though there was no guarantee our application would be accepted, I prayed that the process might help us discern God's will for us in this corner of the diocese. We founded "SHSF School Radio Outreach, Inc." and received non-profit status from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). On February 6th we were notified by the FCC that our application was accepted. We have been assigned FM 107.3 and we have three years to build our radio station. One of our next steps forward is to build a committee/board to help guide us. We will also need to fundraise to purchase an antenna, transmitter, and other necessary equipment. If God is calling you to use your time, talent, or treasure to help this new ministry, please let me know.

Another exciting opportunity that might match your interests is our upcoming middle school retreat in April. Our students will join other diocesan middle school students to witness the upcoming solar eclipse while spending a night together for prayer and community building. Transportation and lodging are expenses we will need to address in the months ahead.

Even if God is not calling you to support these new opportunities, can I ask that you please keep us in your prayers? I pray that God blesses each of us as we focus our attention on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving this Lent!

Guidelines for Lent

The time of Lent is to be observed by Catholics as a special season of prayer, penance, and works of charity. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, in particular, are the most important penitential days of the liturgical year. They are days of both fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

The rule of **fasting** states that only one full meal a day can be taken. Two small meals, "sufficient to maintain strength", are allowed, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals breaks the fast, but drinking liquids does not. The rule of fasting obliges all Catholics from 18 to 59.

Abstinence refers to refraining from eating meat. The rule of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years or older.

The substantial observance of the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious obligation. Self-imposed fasting on the other weekdays of Lent is recommended. Abstinence on all Fridays of the year is also highly recommended. Parents and teachers should see to it that, even those who are not bound by the laws of fast and abstinence because of age, are brought up in an atmosphere that is conducive to a sense of penance.
