From the Pastor's Desk

I mused at one of the daily Masses this past week that Lent can be a challenging season. Sometimes it feels like a chore to do what we're supposed to do for Lent. For example, I usually only ever eat two small meals a day, which means that most days I actually do what the Church asks for fasting (two small meals added together don't equal the big meal). But for some reason on Ash Wednesday, when the Church asked me to fast, I irrationally wanted to eat more – and I craved a large hamburger as well.

Also, in Lent we pray, we fast, and we give alms. But this shouldn't be unusual for us. We are supposed to do this throughout the year. But in Lent, we can find it hard to keep our promises – we find our Lenten promises hard to follow. Why is this?

I think one of the reasons we find Lent hard to follow is that we do not like being told what to do. We all find "obedience" hard for us. Even though we regularly pray, fast, and give, when the Church reminds us to focus on these basics, we balk – we don't like being told that's what we're supposed to do.

As a reminder, Lent is not meant to be an endurance test for us. It's not supposed to be a chance for us to complete a feat of supernatural power. It's meant to help us to open our hearts to God. When we do this, God can form our hearts to make them more like His Sacred Heart – to be truly focused on the needs of other people. Let us pray together that our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving might help open our hearts to be more like God's.
