This Week's Faith Reflections

This month is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Our Rosary (a collection of prayers that is compared to a banquet of roses) has a long history going back to the 1400's. It is said that the primitive Rosaries were nothing more than 150 pebbles in a leather sack. St. Louis de Montfort is said to have composed the narratives that eventually became the Five Mysteries of the Rosary.

Our Lady has appeared over the years instructing the faithful to pray the Rosary (at Fatima, to St. Dominic, e.g.). Clearly, the Holy Rosary is a devotion we must pray regularly (daily!!) especially in these turbulent times. We must always be near to Our Blessed Mother to be near Jesus.

WHY A VERMONT CATHOLIC? ADVANCE DIRECTIVE:

he Diocese of Burlington developed the Vermont Catholic Advance Directive to help you control your own health care if you become unable to communicate or to make decisions yourself. People avoid thinking about illness and death, yet we know that illness and death are realities.

What is an advance directive?

An advance directive is a document you use to appoint someone to act for you if you become unable to communicate or to participate in decisions on your health care. You can also tell your doctor your choices for your care in that document.

Why use the VCAD? Why not other forms?

The VCAD follows Catholic moral teaching on medical care. Other forms do not provide any specific moral guidance and may lead you to make immoral choices. The VCAD also follows Vermont law.

Most states recognize an out-of-state form that is valid in the patient's own state.

Who can be my health care agent?

It can be a trusted family member or friend. But think carefully: Will that person do what you want and advocate for you and your Catholic values? This is explained in the form.

What if I do not have any family nearby?

No problem. The person does not need to live locally. Instructions and discussions may be taken care of over the phone. The agent does not have to be a family member. In fact, many

people ask someone who is not a relative to serve as the health care agent.

What about organ donation?

You may decide to donate organs; you can give that instruction in your form. The one critical issue is that the hospital follows "the dead donor rule" — i.e. does not take the organs before you die. If you have any doubts or misgivings, simply do not donate.

What about my remains? Who can take care of my funeral?

You can also appoint an agent to handle funeral arrangements in the form. It may be a family member or other person. It may be the same person as your health care agent or someone else.

What about funeral instructions?

You may give explicit funeral instructions in the form including the church for a Mass and instructions on burial.

Where can I get a copy of the VCAD? Are instruction materials available?


