





#### Reflections

January 22, 2023 The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A (Matt 4:12-23)



#### The Lord is My Light and My Help-Whom Shall I Fear?

The message of today's readings in one phrase: *light and freedom*. A number of times since the start of the calendar year, Mother Church has invited us to look again and to see deeply. Only when I believe that I am loved and protected by God will I be able to banish fear. The stanzas of Psalm 27 which are put before us today are a veritable feast of fearlessness. Take any verse into the day and let it be a chorus haunting your comings and goings: the Lord is my light and my help- whom shall I fear; I longed to live in the House of the Lord; I am sure I shall see the Lord's goodness; Hope in the Lord, hold firm and take heart. In our first reading, Isaiah paints a similar



picture, using the metaphors of harvest, victory, breaking of yokes and chains. In the same vein, Paul, in our second reading, notes that Jesus cannot be understood in philosophical terms. There is a deeper seeing and a deeper knowing that come from a deeper looking. It is precisely to this kind of looking that Jesus called the first disciples-from

fishing for fish to fishing for people. Do we dare to dance in the freedom that flows from following Jesus?

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let Perpetual Light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in Peace. Amen.

# Rosary, Mass, Rally for Life

Saturday, January 28, 2023 • Montpelier

ach January, pro-life Vermonters gather for the Mass and Rally for Life, often in frigid temperatures, to mark the tragic anniversary of the January 1973 Roe v. Wade decision.

This year, the Mass and Rally for Life will take place on Saturday, Jan. 28, in Montpelier.

Burlington Bishop Christopher Coyne will celebrate the Mass for Life at St. Augustine Church at 9:30 a.m. Mass will be preceded by a Rosary for Life at 9, led by deacons of the Diocese.

Following Mass, participants are invited to join the Rally for Life sponsored by the Vermont Right to Life Committee. As in previous years, the rally will begin at 10:45 a.m. in the City Hall parking lot behind St. Augustine Church. Participants then peacefully will march together to the Statehouse. There on the steps, there will be a brief ceremony, commemorating the lives of more than 63 million unborn babies lost to abortion since the Roe v. Wade decision.

Following the ceremony will be a deli-sandwich buffet luncheon at the Capitol Plaza Hotel, where the featured speaker will be Savannah Craven, the Northeast field operations coordinator for Students for Life. The cost for the buffet is \$20 (scholarships are available for students and young people). Reservations are required for the luncheon. Vermont Right to Life is strongly encouraging students and young people to attend the rally. Craven is a dynamic speaker, and her work at Students for Life includes beginning new pro-life groups at high school and college campuses, reviving existing groups and encouraging students to become strong, pro-life leaders. This event is the largest annual gathering of those committed to the sanctity of life, especially the unborn. As we mark the 50th anniversary of Roe v. Wade and the 63 million unborn babies lost to abortion in its wake, respond to the tragic passing of Article 22 and prayerfully move forward, all are invited to join us as we strive to continue "encouraging, supporting and forming a greater culture of life."
