Reflections

February 12, 2023 The Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A (Matthew 5:17-37)



Virtue Deeper Than That of Scribes and Pharisees

On this 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Paul, in the 2nd Reading, sums up his message in haunting, poetic words to truly touch the heart. He refers to *things no eye has ever seen, no ear has ever heard, things no mind has ever conceived...all that God has prepared for those who love.* If we aspire to such wisdom, we need to turn to God, not books. Today's Responsorial verses are taken from Psalm 119, the longest in the Psalter, and they invite us to love God's law as a map for our pilgrimage on earth.

Our 1st Reading today, taken from Sirach (Ecclesiasticus), challenges us to use our freedom wisely. The message is a repeat of a challenge elsewhere in Scripture (Deuteronomy) where God claims to set before us, life and death, blessing and curse. Then God says, "Choose life." It is this "life" precisely that is behind the new standard pro-



posed by Jesus in today's Gospel. "You have heard... but I..." While Jesus is truly revolutionary, he is in fact insisting on proper observance of the original law, as distinct from the myriad minutiae taught by the Scribes and Pharisees and which had become a burden on the people. Jesus challenges us to make our virtue deeper than that of these Scribes and Pharisees.



rying to figure out who's who is a common human activity. We like to know who we are sharing our time with and what relationship they have to us. So it is with the Church that gathers on Sunday for Mass.

Many of the faces are as familiar as our own, but as with any healthy group, new faces are to be expected and welcomed. Some of those new faces may be responding to a call to find out more about Christ and His Church. The Church opens its arms to these seekers with the wisdom and rituals of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (the OCIA, known formerly as the RCIA).

People who desire to learn more about the Catholic faith and its mission fall into two main groups: catechumens and candidates. A catechumen is someone who has never been baptized, while candidates are those having already been baptized in another Christian denomination and desire to become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church.

Catechumens and candidates undergo a period of formation involving a number of steps and phases. After this formation, they receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist — usually at the Easter Vigil or in the Easter Season. For these catechumens and candidates, Lent is a period of intensified spiritual preparation. At the beginning of Lent, the Diocese of Burlington celebrates a special ritual, the "Rite of Election" for the catechumens and the "Call to Continuing Conversion" for the candidates. Based on the testimony given by the sponsors and catechists, Bishop Christopher Coyne will declare the catechumens to be "Elect," chosen by God for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the upcoming Easter Vigil. The bishop also will recognize the desire of the already-baptized candidates for the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist within our Catholic community.

All members of the faithful throughout the Diocese are encouraged to pray for and with the catechumens and candidates this Lent, especially for the new faces you may see in your own parishes.

All are encouraged to join us for the Diocesan Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion that will be celebrated on Sunday, Feb. 26, at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Burlington at 3 p.m.


