St. Justin Maria Russolillo, the Founder of the Society of Divine Vocations, was born in Pianura (Naples, Italy) on January 18th, 1891. He was ordained a priest on September 20th, 1913. Fr. Justin established the

Vocationist Fathers and Sisters to foster and promote vocations to the priesthood, religious life, and holiness among all God's people. To carry on this vocational work Fr. Justin established the Vocationary, a special house of formation that would supply vocations to both religious orders and diocesan seminaries. The Vocationary was established specially to attend to the needs of those financially unable to attend the seminary and those who are still searching and discerning their vocation.

Fr. Justin died on August 2nd, 1955, at the Vocationist Fathers' Motherhouse in Pianura.

On December 18th, 1997, Pope John Paul II recognized Fr. Justin's heroic virtues and proclaimed him Venerable. On July 1st, 2010, Pope Benedict XVI signed the decree of validity of the miracle by Fr. Justin's intercession to Ida Meloro of East Hanover, New Jersey (USA). He was proclaimed a saint on 15th May, 2022.

The Vocationists' spirituality stems from Fr. Justin's conviction that all people are called to holiness. Their "first duty" is to be with God. Their ultimate goal is to achieve the Divine Union. They are called to establish and live the relationship of "child, parent, and spouse" of God in the pattern of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The Catholic Church, the Holy Family, and the Blessed Trinity are the heart and center of their spirituality, which may be summarized thus: "Ascension to the Trinity with the Holy Family in the Church." Vocationist Fathers and sisters are present in 19 countries. We serve 2 parishes in VT, 1 in MA, 6 in NJ, 2 in NY, 2 in FL and 2 Shrines in NJ as well.

Our Wednesday Prayer group will be known as Friends of Fr. Justin. All are welcome to pray for every vocation: vocation to Priesthood, Religious life; Vocation to Married life and Single life and ultimately vocation to Holiness of Life.

On August 2nd, We will be celebrating the Feast day in honor of St. Justin. Followed by the Mass, and one hour of Adoration, there will be a light social. Please join us. Thank you.

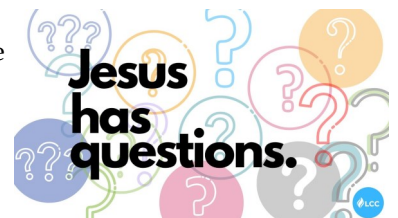

WHEN ALL THINGS
WORK TOGETHER ONTO
GOOD

We can sum up Jesus' mission in the world by saying that he came to teach us a new way of thinking. Through signs, teaching and example he invited us to re-order our priorities. It will mean thinking of others before ourselves. All three readings today conspire to demonstrate what will happen if we choose Jesus' way. When Solomon was told to ask God for anything he wanted, he did not think of himself but of people he was called to lead. Accordingly, he asked for wisdom and understanding. God granted his wish, of course, and added other blessings too.

Our 2nd Reading aims at removing our worries by pointing out that All things work together onto good for those who love God. The blessings which overflow in our 1st and 2nd Readings are characteristic of those who make their way into the Kingdom which Jesus came to establish. This Kingdom is the assembly of those who think differently. It is a hidden treasure waiting to be discovered. It is a pearl of great price, really worth having. It is as a net, encompassing the whole world and all the people. But only those with open eyes will choose to remain there. Let us listen to Jesus' concluding question: "Do you understand?" And we say "Yes."

On July 29, 1853, the Roman Catholic Diocese of Burlington was founded and every year on July 29th we celebrate Founder's Day. In this commemorative anniversary of 170 years, we celebrate all the bishops, pastors, and lay leaders who built our Diocese over the years to our current parishes and ministries.

Bishop Louis deGoësbriand was the first bishop of the Diocese of Burlington and served until his death in 1899. The 'founding bishop', he used all his inherited wealth to build the Church in Vermont, bringing it from missionary territory to leaving behind a Church that had grown in number of Catholics, number of churches, and number of Catholic schools. By 1891, there were eight academies and 16 parochial schools in the Diocese with seven congregations of women religious to staff them, six of the schools founded during this time are still around today. Five priests had awaited his arrival, and the number of Vermont priests grew to 52 in 1892 thanks to his efforts to foster vocations in Vermont and recruit priests from France, Canada and Ireland. The number

of churches increased from 10 to 78 during his episcopacy, and the number of Catholics grew from less than 20,000 to more than 46,000 — most Irish or French-speaking Canadians. "There is no nook, no corner, no hamlet, no village, no town, no city of this Diocese which has not been repeatedly blessed by his presence and his labors," said a bishop during Bishop deGoësbriand's funeral.

We have once again found ourselves as a missionary diocese with an aging population and declining participation, making the ministries of the Bishop's Annual Appeal essential, which include supporting our pastoral ministries, Catholic schools, emergency aid, vocations, and faith formation programs.

This year we are excited to announce that we have received a matching grant of \$10,000 from Vermont Catholic Community Foundation and will be matching all gifts on July 29th, until fulfilled. Please prayerfully consider a gift in honor of the work of the diocese over the last 170 years and in honor of Archbishop Christopher Coyne.

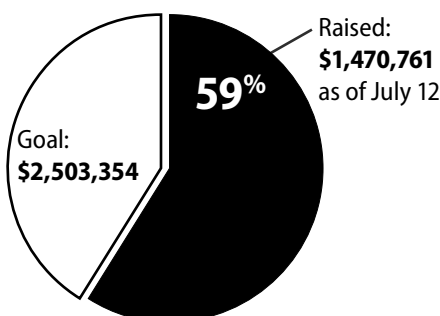
