Reflections

August 20, 2023 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time Year A (1st Reading)



A HOUSE OF PRAYER FOR ALL!

The word "religion" comes from religare, to join together. Think of our English ligament. The irony of all ironies, then, is that something which is designed to link and unite, has become the greatest divider in the history of humankind. The irony is deepened to tragic proportions when those who exclude others, think they are doing a holy thing for God.

God in our 1st Reading reminds us strongly: "My house will be called a house of prayer for all peoples." We cannot blame our ancestors for being exclusionary – we are equally to blame. Just look at inter-sect rivalry in Christianity in our time.

Paul in the 2nd Reading points out that his mission to the gentiles arouses jealousy among the Jews. He presses on regardless because he is at pains to show how God wants "to show mercy to all mankind." The Gospel is a repeat of one we read less than two weeks ago, but it fits perfectly in the present context. Jesus, who has been nourished by the exclusionary ethos of the Old Testament is not inclined to do a favour for the gentile lady who has approached him. To his great credit he allows himself to be corrected by her, and moved by her great faith into accepting her. Can we rise to such inclusiveness?

The Inland See

Christopher Braves is fixing the graves

hristopher and Delana Braves of Richmond recently established two funds in the Vermont Catholic Community Foundation to honor the legacy of their parents and grandparents.

"You always respect and honor those that passed before you," Delana said. "When we go into a cemetery we pray for the dead. Our prayers are an intercession on behalf of the dead to be in heaven. We are also asking the dead to pray and intercede on our behalf for our journey to heaven."

Last year, the couple established the Edward A. and Ann M. O'Neill Mobbs Memorial Holy Rosary Cemetery and St. Mary Cemetery Reserve Fund at Our Lady of the Holy Rosary Parish in Richmond. One of the primary purposes of the fund is to fix broken and overturned headstones. The fund honors Delana's parents, for whom the fund is named.

"My parents had a special mission to care for the cemeteries where their relatives were buried," Delana said. "It was important for us to carry on their legacy."

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "The bodies of the dead must be treated with respect and charity, in hope and faith of the Resurrection. The burial of the dead is a corporal work of mercy; it honors the children of God, who are temples of the Holy Spirit."

"These cemeteries were established in the 1800s and need a lot of repairs," Christopher said. He began his ministry repairing headstones nine years ago when he noticed one that had fallen over on his morning run. "Every morning I would run down Cochran Road and say the rosary. On one run, I noticed a grave stone had fallen over," he said. A few years ago, he rebuilt his garage to include a workshop above it where he spends many hours preparing materials for repairing headstones. He calls his workshop "The St. Joseph's Workshop."

He grew up in Rutland with many family ties to the community, especially Mount St. Joseph Academy, a school his mother and her siblings attended. Both of his grandmothers played a significant role in his life, especially in his faith.

Last fall, Christopher and Delana established the Thomas F. and Florence E. Chapleau Dunn Family and Christos D. and Catherine T. Lines Braves Family Memorial Mount St. Joseph Academy Fund in honor of his family to support operations of the school. As an educator and coach working with children his entire life, he wanted to do something that honored his family and his faith.

"Today, because of people like Mr. and Mrs. Braves, we can continue our mission to educate the whole person in mind,

body, and spirit and remain accessible to all who desire a challenging Catholic educational experience," said MSJ Principal Michael Alexander.


