

### REFLECTIONS

November 26, 2023

JESUS CHRIST: PRIEST, PROPHET, KING:

The roots of Christianity go far back to the intertwining of three great traditions of priesthood, prophecy, and kingship. All three are very strong in the Old Testament. And all three appear again in the New Testament. But somewhere along the way we seem to have lost both the prophetic and the priestly threads. Perhaps it happened when Christianity got into bed with Empire under Con-



stantine in 313 AD. Our Bishops were suddenly Princes of the Church and lived in Palaces. How far-removed from mini-assemblies in the Catacombs! And so we celebrate today the Feast of Christ the King. We need to set our excitement within the framework of what Jesus replied when Pilate asked him if he was a King: He implied that he was a King but added that his Kingdom was not of this world. The three readings today help us to understand what it means to be a true King. It is about shepherding, about gathering, about nurturing, about protecting. And there is the paradoxical application in the lives of the subjects: what we do to and for others, we do to and for our King. Our King is not remote and above he is imminent, among, with. Truly Jesus' kingship is not of this world. It is our greatest privilege to serve such a King as Jesus.




