

Sacrament of Baptism


Parents are asked to contact the Parish Office to schedule a meeting.

The Cathedral of St. Joeph is preparing to participate in the first ever diocesan-wide *Christ Our Hope: Building a Vibrant Church* campaign. This campaign is rooted in the works of Christ (Matthew 4:23) and the outcomes of the synod to build vibrant parishes (**Preaching**), strengthen our evangelization (**Teaching**) and communicate the compassion of Christ in our service to the most vulnerable (**Healing**).

This campaign offers a wonderful opportunity for St. Joseph Cathedral not only financially - 60% of the funds we raise come back to us for our use to address specific parish needs -- but as a larger Catholic community, together we will renew, strengthen and secure a future for the Catholic Church in Vermont.

This weekend, Bishop Coyne will celebrate the official public kickoff. He will give his thoughts so you can learn more about why this campaign is so important. He will speak at the beginning of the Sunday 10AM Mass which will be livestreamed at:

A group of parishioners, along with Fr. Harlow, are working to identify how the 60% of the funds raised will be used in the Parish. Those goals will be announced by the end of August.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

August 15th & 16th, 2020

The 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Isaiah 56:1, 6-7 The Lord brings foreigners into his house of prayer.

Psalm 67 "O God, let all the nations praise you!"

Romans 11:13-15 The call of God is irrevocable

Matthew 15:21-28 Great is the faith of the Canaanite woman.

God's grace in the world is boundless and always has been. Isaiah tells the Israelites that foreigners will be brought to God's holy mountain to worship, to pray, and to celebrate.

Paul refers to himself as "apostle to the Gentiles," bringing news of God's mercy to all. Jesus heals the daughter of the Canaanite woman who persists in her pursuit of Him. Let us listen to God's word and contemplate the boundaries we are called to break down.


