

LENTEN SPEAKER SERIES - SAVE THE DATES!

In the midst of the chaos and noise surrounding the issue of immigration, we can easily lose sight of the teachings of our Catholic Church and the faces of those involved. These will be brought into sharp focus this **Tuesday**, **March 12**, when Sacred Heart is proud to host a "Migration Teach-In" for the opening session of our Lenten Speaker series. We invite all people of good will who are open to learning from others' experiences and the Church's teaching on the rights of refugees and asylum seekers. The Teach-In will include personal testimonies from immigrants and small group discussions. This session runs from 7:00-9:00

p.m., and is limited to 60 people. The Lenten Series, organized by our Peace & Justice Commission, also includes the topics of Housing Segregation in St. Louis (3/19), Human Trafficking (3/26), and Laudato Sí/Environment (4/9). THE PRAYER CORNER

A parishioner's personal testimony to prayer in their life

One form of prayer that I have learned recently is titled, "Lectio Divina". That is Latin for "Divine Reading". Many other forms of prayer that have steps to them encourage us to talk TO God and then listen. I rarely hear the voice of God from within. Catholic speaker Tim Gray explains that the normative form of listening to God, is to hear his voice in reading the Bible. Therefore, the first and most important step in Lectio is reading scripture. There is an hour long talk by

Tim Gray on Formed.org that explains this more deeply and a six-week session; if you want to understand this method more deeply. My plan here is to summarize the steps for you.

- 1. Lectio: Read-slowly, carefully, reflectively a passage in the Bible. Stop when you feel God is trying to tell you something. This could be the readings of the day or other passages.
- 2. Meditation: reflect on that passage.
- 3. Oracio: Pray to God in relationship to what you hear in the passage.
- 4. Contemplation: Where is God guiding the conversation?
- 5. Resolution: write a resolution for the day or week in relationship to the conversation you had with God. Write down the Bible verse to help you recall where God is leading you.

One sided conversations get boring. Allow God to speak to you through the Bible. This may be what you need to reinvigorate your prayer life.

LENTEN OBSERVANCE AND RESOURCES—ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS

The Blessing of Ashes should take place within the celebration of the Mass or a scheduled service consisting of at least an appointed Scripture reading and a brief homily stressing the meaning of the ashes as a symbol of penance and self-denial. Please refer to the *Book of Blessing* for additional information that will be of assistance to you in this matter.

In the case of genuine pastoral necessity, Archbishop Carlson has given permission for lay ministers (for example, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion) to assist the priest and deacon in the distribution of the blessed ashes.

The Blessing of the Ashes is reserved to the priest or deacon, and priests and deacons should participate in the distribution of the ashes, whenever possible. They are the primary ministers of the ritual.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 6, 2019) and Good Friday (April 19, 2019) are days of abstinence for all Catholics from age 14 & up. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of *abstinence* from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance. Following are several resources that can aid in finding different forms of prayer and penance.

REMOVING HOLY WATER FROM FONTS NOT PERMITTED

In previous years, some parishes have taken the holy water out of the holy water fonts during Lent, replaced the water with sand, or covered with a purple cloth. I understand this concept is to convey the thought that Lent is a time of spiritual dryness--a "desert" experience--that precedes Easter, in which we refrain from using the sacramental of holy water. However, despite its popularity in some places, this practice is not permitted. It has been the Church's practice to empty the holy water fonts only during Triduum, but for a different reason. It is not permitted to have them empty through the whole season of Lent.

The Congregation for Divine Worship has stated: This Dicastery is able to respond that the removing of Holy Water from the fonts during the season of Lent is not permitted:

- 1. The liturgical legislation in force does not foresee this innovation, which in addition to being "praeter legem" [i.e., "apart from the law"] is contrary to a balanced understanding of the season of Lent, which though truly being a season of penance, is also a season rich in the symbolism of water and baptism, constantly evoked in liturgical texts.
- 2. The encouragement of the Church that the faithful avail themselves frequently of the sacraments is to be understood to apply also to the season of Lent. The "fast" and "abstinence" which the faithful embrace in this season does not extend to abstaining from the sacraments or sacramentals of the Church.
- 3. The practice of the Church has been to empty the Holy Water fonts on the days of the Sacred Triduum in preparation of the blessing of the water at the Easter Vigil, and it corresponds to those days on which the Eucharist is not celebrated (i.e., Good Friday and Holy Saturday) [3/14/03: Prot. N. 569/00/L].

Lent is a Season of reflection, penance, fasting, and service. May the Lord strengthen you as you continue to share this message with your parishioners? Be assured of my prayers for both you and the people in your parish throughout this Lenten Season.
