Dear Parishioners,

We would like to address the parish debt and explain why we are considering doing a campaign. The parish has been very generous. We have expanded a lot since the 90's through loans from the Archdiocese.

We currently pay \$15,000 a month to the Archdiocese for loan repayments. After October, we will have one loan paid off. The remaining loan has a balance of \$1.8 million. We also owe the Archdiocese \$900.000 in back assessments.

The assessments are 8% of our income. Three percent of it is for operational expenses for employees and ministries of the Archdiocese. Four percent of this 8% goes to the grade schools and high schools to help with tuition.


