





After virtually disappearing for two years in the U.S. as the COVID-19 pandemic shut down society, there are hints the flu could reemerge this fall, potentially causing an unusually early and possibly severe flu season. The flu season hit early and hard in some countries in the Southern Hemisphere (such as Australia) this past winter. And what happens during the winter south of the equator often foreshadows what will happen in the Northern Hemisphere. So what can you do to protect yourself and your family from the flu:

- Get the flu vaccine, if you are willing and able;
- Stay home if you are sick;
- Wear a mask if you need to leave the house and have symptoms of the flu;
- Sneeze and cough into your elbow;
- Wash your hands frequently;
- Avoid touching your eyes, hands, and mouth; and
- Practice other good health habits like getting enough rest, eating healthy.

Flu symptoms may include: Fever or feeling feverish, chills; cough; sore throat; runny or stuffy nose; Muscle or body aches; headache; tiredness and some have vomiting or diarrhea (but this is more common in children. If you think you may have the flu, call your doctor as early as you can, as there are antiviral medications that can be ordered to decrease the severity of the flu. Equally important is to get plenty of rest and stay hydrated.
